This manual describes how to properly use your new MP3 player. Read it carefully to avoid damaging the player and injuring yourself. Pay particular attention to the following serious warnings.



<u> C</u>AUTION

Situations that may result in death or serious injury to yourself or others

- Do not use the product during a thunderstorm. Thunderstorms can cause the player to malfunction and increases the risk of electric shock.
- Using earphones or headphones for an extended time may cause serious damage to your hearing.

If you are exposed to sound louder than 85db for an extended time, you may adversely affect your hearing. The louder the sound is, the more seriously damaged your hearing may be. Note that an ordinary conversation is between 50 to 60 db and road noise is approximately 80 db.

You are strongly advised to set the volume level to medium. The medium level is usually less than 2/3 of the maximum.

- If you hear a ringing in your ear(s), lower the volume or stop using the earphones or headphones.
- Exposure to loud sounds while walking or driving may distract your attention and cause an accident.
- Do not use the earphones while riding a bicycle, driving an automobile or motorcycle, or while walking or jogging on a road or in a crosswalk. The earphones may prevent you from hearing oncoming traffic and lead to a serious accident. Using earphones when driving is also prohibited by law in some areas.
- Use only accessories provided by or approved by Samsung.
- When hanging the product around your neck, do not apply pressure to the neck strap. To prevent accidental choking, keep the neck strap away from children, the elderly, and people incapable of caring for themselves.

- Stop using the product if you feel uncomfortable when watching videos or playing games.
 Consult your physician before using the product if any of your family has experienced seizures or fainting.
 Stop using the product and consult your physician if you experience cramping in the face or muscles, dizziness, disorientation, or nausea.
 Avoid watching videos or playing games on the product for an extended period of time.
- Do not expose your eyes to direct sunlight through the screen of the product. It may damage your eyes.
- Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly replaced. Replace only with the same or equivalent type.



Situations that could cause damage to yourself or the product

- Do not disassemble, repair, or modify this product on your own.
- For your safety, make sure the earphone cable does not get in the way of your arm or become entangled in nearby objects while you are exercising or walking.
- Do not get the product wet or drop it in water. If the product gets wet, do not switch it on. You could get an electric shock.
- Do not leave the player in locations with temperatures above 35° C (95° F), such as saunas or a parked cars.

- Do not use the product near speakers, large electric motors, strong magnetic fields, high voltage power lines, or communication towers. The product may malfunction due to electromagnetic waves.





Connect to a PC and charge the battery

Connect your player to a PC and charge the battery before you use your player for the first time or when you have not used it for a long time.




The rechargeable battery incorporated in this product is not user replaceable. For information on its replacement, please contact your service provider.



Push the USB switch.

- The USB plug comes out.
- 2 Connect the USB plug to the USB port of your PC.





When the battery is fully charged, unplug the USB plug from the PC.

Use basic functions > Connect to a PC and charge the battery

About the battery

- Charge and store the battery at 5° C \sim 35° C (41° F \sim 95° F).
- Do not charge the battery for more than 12 hours or leave the battery fully discharged for a long time. Doing so may shorten the battery life.
- Depending on how you use your player, actual battery life may vary and may be shorter than specified.

Note

- The charging time may differ depending on your PC's capabilities.
- If you want to charge the battery on your laptop, make sure that the laptop's battery is full or the laptop is plugged into a power source.
- The player can only be charged by connecting to your PC with the USB plug. Do not use a separate USB AC Adapter. It may not charge the battery or allow proper operation of the player.

Note

- The Popcon character settings appear when you turn on the player for the first time. See "My Popcon settings" on page 34.
- If you do not use your player for 1 minute, it will automatically turn off. You can adjust auto power off time. See page 36.

Lock or unlock the buttons

Lock the buttons to prevent any unwanted operations while listening to music. Press () () to lock or unlock the buttons.



When the buttons are locked, 🔒 will appear at the top of the screen.

- We regularly upgrade Kies for peak performance. Some features of Kies may change without prior notice.
- Connect the USB plug to the USB port of your PC.
 - See page 11 to connect the player to your PC.
 - When the player is connected to your PC, Kies launches automatically on your PC.
- Click 💒 in the Kies Widget Dock.
- Click () at the top of the Contents Manager.
 - Click 🔈 at the top left of the window.
 - Select a folder or file you want.
 - The list of the files stored in your PC appears.
- Select a file, and then click 🚽 at the bottom right of the window.
 - The selected file is copied to your player.

Note

- You cannot use your player when it is connected to a PC.
- If you connect your player to a PC when the player's battery is low, the battery charges for a few minutes before your player links to the PC and Kies launches.
- · Connect the player directly to the USB port of your PC. If you connect through a USB hub or a USB extension cable, your player may not work properly.
- When you format your player on a PC, use the FAT32 system. In Windows Vista/7, click <Restore device defaults> and then format your player.

 - 3 Select a folder you want.
 - 4 Copy files from the PC to your player.



Note

- The order of files on your PC will differ from the order of files in your player.
- Your player restricts playback of files protected by a DRM (Digital Rights Management) system.

What is DRM?

Digital Rights Management (DRM) is a technology and service that prevents the illegal copying of digital contents and protects the profit and rights of copyright holders or content producers. Manage music files > Download music files

Disconnect your player from a PC

Carefully follow the steps below when disconnecting your player from a PC to avoid data loss or damage to your player.

- Do not disconnect your player when playing files stored in your player on a PC. Make sure that you stop playback and then disconnect your player from a PC.





Music files are categorised in folders by type. You can easily find a music file you want.

Recorded Files	Display files recorded in <fm radio=""> or <voice rec="">.</voice></fm>
Music Browser	Display all files in the Music folder.
Unknown	Display files that have no track information (ID3 tag).

What is ID3 an tag?

An ID3 tag is a metadata container attached to an MP3 file. It includes information about the music, such as the title, artist, album, or track number, which a player can display on its screen during playback.

Delete music files from a playlist

- Select a file you want to delete, and then press

 - Files deleted from a playlist are not deleted from the player.

Study Mode

Repeat a section of a track

You can select a section of a track to repeat.

- Press <u>....</u> at the beginning of the section you want to repeat.
 - $<\!\!A \rightarrow >$ displays at the top of the screen.
- Press <u>at the end of the section you want to repeat.</u>
 - <A \leftrightarrow B> displays at the top of the screen. Your player repeats the marked section.
 - To cancel repeating, press again.

Note

You must set the end point at least 3 seconds after the start point.

Change the playback speed

Change the playback speed. While playing a track, press $\hfill \square$ to select the playback speed.

Set skip interval

While playing a track, press 🗋 to skip backward or forward in 10-second intervals.



Some files may not skip at the interval.



SoundAlive

Select appropriate sound effects for music. While playing music, press $\fbox{\begin{subarray}{c} \hline \dots with the sound effect. \end{subarray}}$

Note

- If you select <Auto>, your player searches the track information (ID3 tag) and automatically selects an appropriate effect.
- To select your own equaliser, select <User>.

Example: Set your own equalizer to <User>

- 1 In the main menu, select <Settings>.
- 2 Select <Music>.
- 3 Select <SoundAlive>.
- Select <User>, and then press .
- Select a mode, and then adjust the settings.

Play Speed

FM Radio

You can listen to the FM radio as well as save radio stations.

Note

You must connect the earphones to your player to listen to the FM radio. The earphones serve as a radio antenna.



Listen to the FM radio



In the main menu, select <FM Radio>.

- Press 🕕 to scan the radio stations.
 - Press
 / to scroll through radio frequencies.
 - Press and hold <a>/ /
 to scan the available stations automatically.

Note

- The FM radio may not tune frequencies for stations correctly depending on the signal strength and transmitting conditions in your current region.
- Press 🖲 to mute or un-mute the FM radio.

What is RDS?

- Radio Data System (RDS) provides program information such as News, Sports, Music, or station information which is displayed on the screen.
- If the FM signal strength is weak, the player may not display RDS information.
- RDS will be available only in Europe regions.

Record the FM radio

You can record audio from an FM radio station.

- While listening to the FM radio, press and hold
 - The recording starts.
 - Press

 to pause recording.
- 2 Press and hold <u>enve</u> again to stop recording.
 - The player saves the recorded file automatically.
- 3 Select <Yes> to play the recorded file.
 - After playing the recorded file, the FM radio screen appears.
 - To return to the FM radio screen, select <No>.

Note

- You cannot record the FM radio when the battery is low.
- The maximum recording time for a file is 4 hours.
- The recorded files are saved in <My files> \rightarrow <Recorded Files> \rightarrow <FM Radio>.


