
Headset jack: Use a headset for hands-free conversation or for listening to music

Power:

- Press and hold for 5 seconds to turn the device on or off.
- To save battery, quick press to turn the screen on or off temporarily.

NOTE: The battery can also be charged while connected to a computer.

Users have to use the connection to USB interfaces with a USB 2.0 version or higher.

1.3 Installing the SIM card, battery and memory card

To remove the back cover

- 1. Turn the device off.
- 2. Push and slide down to open the back cover.



SIM card


The SIM card contains your phone number, memory storage and network service details.

To install the SIM card

Insert the SIM card as shown. Make sure that the gold contacts are facing down and that the cut-off corner is facing towards the battery slot.

To remove the SIM card

- 1. Remove the battery.
- 2. Use your finger to slide the SIM card from the card slot.




Battery

This device comes with a rechargeable Li-lon battery. Battery life varies depending on the network and applications used and the type of connections attached to this device.


To install the battery

Insert the battery. Make sure that the contacts of the battery are aligned with the connectors on the battery slot.



To remove the battery

Use your fingertip to lift the battery tab and remove the battery.



To replace the back cover

Secure the hooks on the back cover with the designated holes on the device and close the back cover.



NOTE: To ensure battery performance and avoid the risk of fire:

- Only use the original batteries designated for the device.
- Do not store the battery in temperatures below -10°C or higher than 45°C.

Memory card

You will need a microSD[®] card to store photos, music, videos and other data.

To install the memory card

- 1. Insert the memory card with the gold contacts facing down.
- 2. Push the memory card until it clicks into place.

To remove the memory card

- For safe removal of the memory card, tap
 Application Drawer > Settings > SD card,
 USB Mass storage & phone storage >
 Unmount SD card.
- 2. Push the memory card down to eject it from the slot.




1.4 Charging the battery

The battery out of the box is only partially charged. To fully charge the battery, charge it for 2 hours.

- 1. Open the Micro USB port cover.
- 2. Plug in the battery charger as shown in the diagram.
- 3. Plug the AC adaptor into the wall socket to start charging.

When the battery is charging, the red LED is activated; the icon is also displayed in the status bar. When the battery is fully charged, the red LED disappears and the green LED is activated; if the device is turned on,




NOTE:

- The battery can also be charged when you connect the device to a computer with a USB cable.
- To ensure safety, do not remove the battery from the device while the AC adaptor is connected or while it is being charged.

1.5 Using the headset

For hands-free conversation or to listen to music, plug a headset into the headset jack. **NOTE**:

- When using a headset, your ability to hear outside sounds may be limited.
 Do not use the headset if it will endanger you.
- Do not set the volume to its maximum with a headset as it may damage your hearing.



1.6 Turning the phone on or off

After installing the SIM card and charging the battery, the device is ready to be turned on.

To turn on your phone

Press and hold the power button until the device vibrates.


To turn off your phone

- 1. Press and hold the power button for 5 seconds.
- 2. A pop-up window appears, tap Power off.
- 3. Select **OK** to confirm.

To set your phone to sleep mode

To set this device to sleep mode, press the power button briefly. This will turn the display off.

To turn the display on, press the power button briefly.



1.7 Unlocking the screen

To unlock the screen

- 1. Press the power button or front buttons briefly to turn on the display from sleep mode.
- 2. Tap and swipe right to unlock the screen.

1.8 Turning the sound on or off

To enable/disable the sound

- 1. Press the power button or front buttons briefly to turn on the display from sleep mode.
- 2. Tap and swipe left to turn the sound off.
- 3. To turn on the sound, repeat the steps above.



Chapter 2: The basics

2.1 The Home screen

From the Home screen, you can quickly access common features and view notifications of missed calls, received messages, check battery and connection status.



Status bar


- Displays status and notification icons and clock.
- Message, appointment, task and connection notifications are also displayed here.

Status bar icons

The Status bar icons indicate different types of information. Tap the status bar and scroll down to view ongoing phone activities or notifications easily. To close the window, press \bigcirc .

Shortcut menu

The Shortcut menu displays notifications or other information related to each menu item. To easily access the menu, tap the item on the Home screen. By default, the following applications are displayed:

Customising the Shortcut menu

To add a shortcut:

- 1. Tap **Menu** > **Add** > **Shortcuts**.
- 2. Tap Widgets to display the list of widgets.
- 3. Tap to add the items that you want to appear on the Home screen.



To remove a shortcut:

- Tap and hold the desired shortcut icon.
 The icon expands.
- 2. appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 3. Drag the icon to **to** to delete.

 The shortcut icon is then removed.



Application drawer

The Application drawer contains all applications and settings. On the Home screen, tap **to** display the menu.

Extended Home screen

Swipe your finger to the left or right across the Home screen.

The two left and two right extensions to the Home screen provide more space for icons, widgets, shortcuts and other items.



Using widgets


Save time with live updates right on the Home screen and get all of your personalised updates in one place.

You may add and customise the widgets on the Home screen as you like.

- From the Home screen, tap Menu > Add > Widgets.
 A gallery list of all available widgets is displayed.
- 2. Tap to select the widget that you want to appear on the Home screen.

To remove widgets:

- 1. From the Home screen, tap and hold the desired widget. The widget expands.
- 2. 💼 appears at the bottom of the Home screen.
- 3. Drag the widget to me to delete. The widget is then removed.



Setting the wallpaper

You can customise your Home screen wallpaper with default wallpaper or with pictures taken with this device.

Set wallpaper from Pictures

- From the Home screen, tap Menu > Add > Wallpapers.
- 2. **Select wallpaper from** is displayed on screen.
- 3. Tap Gallery.
- 4. Tap to select pictures taken from the camera in the phone or saved on your SD card.
- You will see thumbnail images of all pictures.
 Tap to select the picture that you want to use as wallpaper.
- 6. Drag your finger to select the crop area and tap inside the box to crop the image.
- 7. Tap **Save** and the cropped image appears as wallpaper on the Home screen.

Set wallpaper from Wallpaper gallery

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Menu** > **Add** > **Wallpapers**.
- 2. **Select wallpaper from** is displayed on screen.
- 3. Tap Live wallpapers or Wallpapers.
- 4. All system wallpapers are displayed. Swipe your finer left or right to view all available wallpapers.
- 5. Tap to preview the wallpaper.
- 6. Tap **Set wallpaper** to apply your selection.



2.2 LED indicators

This device has 2 LED indicators: green and red. Whether this device is turned on or off, the LED indicators provide useful information.

LED	Location	Phone status	Indication
Green (solid)	Send button	Phone On/Off	Battery is fully charged.
Red (solid)	End button	Phone On/Off	Battery is charging.

NOTE: When the device is on, pressing the **Send** or **End** button will light all the LED indicators.


2.3 Adjusting the volume

This device has three types of volume, which can be adjusted separately:

- Media volume: Set the volume for music and videos.
- Ringer volume: Set the volume for incoming calls and notifications.
- In-call volume: Set the volume during a call.

To adjust ringer volume

- Tap Application drawer > Settings > Sound & display.
- 2. In the Sound settings submenu, tap **Ringer volume** and the Ringer volume slider appears.
- 3. To adjust the volume, complete either of the following:
 - a. Drag the volume slider to adjust the volume.
 - b. Press the volume button. Slide the volume button up or down to adjust the volume.



3. Tap 5 to exit the menu.

To adjust in-call volume

- 1. During a phone call, press the volume button on the right.
- 2. Slide the volume button up or down to adjust the volume.

To adjust media volume

- Tap Application drawer > Settings > Sound & display.
- In the Sound settings submenu, tap Media volume and the Media volume slider appears.
- 3. Drag the volume slider to adjust the volume.

2.4 Contacts

Contacts is your phonebook that lets you store names, phone numbers, email addresses and other information. Contacts are stored in the phone memory. You can save information such as names, pictures, phone numbers, email addresses, etc. You can also add frequently used contacts to the favorites list. See "Favorite contacts" on page 16.

Adding a contact


- 1. On the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **New contact**. The New contact window appears.
- 3. Tap each field to enter the contact information using the on-screen keyboard.

TIPS:

 To add a picture, tap Image Icon, then select a picture file or take a photo of the contact immediately. To take a photo of the contact,



4. Tap **Done** to save.



Searching for contacts

On the Contacts screen, complete any of the following to easily search for contacts:

- Tap Menu > Search.
- Type the first few letters of the contact to search.
 The list is filtered as you type.
- Tap an alphabetical index to view contacts that start with the letter. For example, to view names that start with "k", tap "k" and the list of contacts will be displayed.
- To filter the contacts list by categories, tap Menu > Display options. Tick the box to display Only contact with phones.



Importing contacts

Copy SIM contacts to the phone

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import/Export > Import from SIM card.
- 3. Tap **OK**.

NOTE:

- To copy a single contact, simply tap the contact, then edit contact information as in "Adding a contact".
- To copy all contacts, tap Menu > Import all.
 All contacts on the SIM card are imported.



Copy microSD contacts to the phone

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import/Export > Import from SD card.

NOTE:

- To copy a single contact, simply tap the contact, tap Import one VCard file and tap to select the contact that you want to copy. Then edit contact information as in "Adding a contact".
- To copy multiple contacts, tap Import multiple VCard files. Tick to select contacts on the memory card to be imported.
- To copy all contacts, tap Import all VCard files. All contacts on the memory card are imported.
- 3. Tap **OK**.



Backing up contacts

You can copy the contacts to the memory card to back up the contact information in this device.

Export contacts to the memory card

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. Tap Menu > Import/Export > Export to SD card. NOTE:
 - Copying contacts to the memory card will overwrite the old backup file.
- 3. A warning message pops up, tap **OK** to proceed. All contacts are copied to the memory card.

Favorite contacts

You can add the most frequently called contacts to the favorite contact list which helps you to access the contacts quickly and easily.

Add to favorites


- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. From the contact list, tap and hold the desired contact.
- 3. Tap Add to favorites.
- 4. The contact now appears in the favorites list.

Remove from Favorites

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- Tap the **Favorites** tab.The favorites list is displayed.
- 3. Tap and hold the desired contact to display the submenu.
- 4. Tap Remove from favorites.

The contact will be removed from the favorites list.






Chapter 3: Using the phone

To open the Phone screen, complete any of the following:

- On the Home screen, tap **Phone**.
- From any application screen, press the **Send** button.



3.1 Voice calls

Making a call

To make a call from the Phone screen

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Phone**.
- 2. Tap the phone number on the keypad.

NOTE: Tap to erase a wrong number. Tap and hold to erase the entire number.

- 3. Tap the phone number or press the **Send** button to dial.
- 4. To end the call, press the **End** button.



To make a call from Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the desired contact.
- 3. Tap **Call home**, **Call work** or **Call mobile**. Alternatively, press the **Send** button to dial the default number.



To make emergency calls

Emergency calls without a SIM card:

- 1. Open the Phone screen.
- 2. Tap the emergency number on the keypad.
- 3. Tap the phone number or press the **Send** button.

To make international calls

- 1. Open the Phone screen.
- 2. Tap and hold 0 + until the international prefix code "+" is displayed.
- 3. Enter the country code, area code and the phone
- 4. Tap the phone number or press the **Send** button.



When you receive an incoming call:

- The device rings if the ring volume is turned on.
- A notification message appears on the screen.

To accept or reject an incoming call

- To accept the call, press the **Talk / Send** button.
- To reject the call, press the **End** button.

To put a call on hold

If a call comes in while you are already on another call, tap **Menu** > **Hold** to put the first call on hold.

To take a call off hold, tap **Hold** again.

To switch between calls

If a call comes in while you are already on another call, tap **Menu > Hold** to put the first call on hold.

Tap **Menu** > **Swap calls** \mathbb{S} to switch between calls.

To set up conference calls

- 1. If you are already on a call, tap **Menu** > **Hold** to put the call on hold.
- 2. Tap **Add** (1) to display the dial pad and then enter the second number that you want to call.
- 3. Tap Merge calls \uparrow to set up the conference call.





NOTE: Conference call is a network service. Check with your network provider for the availability of this function.

To manage other voice call features

- Tap Menu > Speaker to activate or deactivate the speakerphone.
- Tap **Menu** > **Mute** to mute or unmute the microphone.
- To view the call history, from the Home screen tap **Menu** > **Phone** > **Call log**.

Ending a call

To end a call, tap **End call** or press the **End** button.



3.2 Voice mail

Listening to voice mail

To listen to a voice mail message

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Phone.
- 2. Tap ot listen to your voice mail messages.

NOTE: Before you use the voice mail service, you need to add a voice mail number.

Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Call settings > Voicemail settings.

Use the numeric keypad to enter the voice mail number and tap OK.


3. After listening to the voice mail messages, press the **End** button.



Chapter 4: Entering information

4.1 On-screen keyboard

The on-screen keyboard appears in portrait mode when an application requires text input, such as messaging and writing emails. The keyboard input method is activated by default.



Using the on-screen keyboard

Tap the screen to display the on-screen keyboard.



- Use the on-screen keyboard as you would use a computer keyboard.
- Tap the keys to enter characters.
- To toggle between upper and lower case letter display, tap
- To display the numeric and symbols keyboard, tap 12, . Tap to toggle back.

Setting the input method

This device supports several text input methods, select your preferred method.


- Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Language & keyboard.
- 2. In the Text settings submenu, a list of the input methods is displayed. Select and check the options that you prefer.

Changing the input method

Tap and hold any text field in a programme.
 For instance, in Messaging, tap and hold the field "To:".

The Input method screen pops up.


2. You may select one of the available input methods to use.



4.2 Configuring phone keyboard settings

You can use the keyboard aids to help you when you input text with the device keyboard.

- Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Language & keyboard.
- 2. Tap TouchPal.
- 3. Select the applicable options from the following: Basic settings, Prediction & Gestures, Chinese and Handwriting submenus.
 - Basic settings: Options available include
 Word prediction, Key press sound, Key press
 vibration, Layout in portrait mode, Layout in
 landscape mode, Swipe to switch layout,
 Mixed language input and Select languages.
 - Prediction & Gestures: Options available include Predict next word, Correct mistyping, Slide-down symbols and Relevant words.
 - Chinese: tap Ambiguous PinYin to see more options.



Chapter 5: Email & messaging

Use **Messaging** to access text and MMS messages. Use **Email** to send and receive email messages via your Internet email accounts.

To open messaging

- On the Home screen, tap
- From the Application drawer, tap Messaging.

5.1 Text messages


A text message can only contain letters, numbers and symbols.

Creating and sending a text message

This device offers several ways to create and send a new text message.


From the Messaging screen

- 1. Tap New message.
- 2. The Compose screen is displayed.
- 3. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
 - **TIP:** To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select.
- 4. Type your message in the **Type to compose** field.
- 5. Tap **Send** or press the **Send** button to send your message.



From Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts.
- 2. Tap and hold a contact to display the options menu.
- 3. Tap Text contact.
- 4. Compose the contents.
- 5. Tap Send.



From Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap the Call log tab to view all call history.
- 3. Tap a call from the Call log.
- 4. Tap Send text message.
- 5. Compose the contents.
- 6. Tap Send.

Note: If you exit Messaging before sending a message, the unsent message will automatically be saved as a draft.

To request message delivery notification


- In Messaging, tap Menu > Settings to access SMS and MMS settings.
- 2. Tap to tick **Delivery reports** checkbox.
- 3. Tap to exit the menu.

Receiving and managing messages

When you send and receive messages from a contact, these messages are grouped as a message thread. A message thread looks like an exchanged conversation.


To reply to a text message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap **Type to compose** to compose your message.
- 4. Tap Send.




To lock a text message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap to view a message thread.
- 3. Tap and hold a message to display the message options.
- 4. Tap Lock message.
- 5. The message is locked and will not be deleted when the conversation limit reaches the maximum.
- 6. To unlock a message, repeat the steps above.



To forward a text message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap to view a message thread.
- 3. Tap and hold a message to display the message options.
- 4. Tap Forward.
- 5. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number.
- 6. Tap **Send**.




To delete all text messages

You can delete all text threads in Messaging.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap **Menu** > **Delete threads**. A warning message pops up.


NOTE: To delete locked messages, tick **Delete** locked messages.

3. Tap **Delete** to confirm the deletion of all message threads.




To delete one message thread

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap and hold the message thread that you want to delete.
- 3. Tap **Delete thread**.



To delete a message within a thread

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap the message thread to open it.
- Highlight the message to be deleted by flicking your finger down across the sender of the message.
- 4. Tap and hold the highlighted message.
- 5. Tap **Delete message**.



To copy message text

You can use this function to copy the text from a message to a new message that you are composing.

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Messaging**.
- 2. Tap a message thread to open it.
- 3. Tap and hold the message to display the submenu options.
- 4. Tap Copy message text.
- 5. Go to New message.
- 6. Tap and hold **Type to compose**.
- 7. Tap **Paste** to paste the copied text to your new message.



5.2 Multimedia messages

A Multimedia message or MMS can contain letters, an image, an audio or video file.

Creating and sending an MMS message

This device offers several ways to create and send an MMS message.

From the Messaging screen

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.
- 2. Tap New message.
- Tap Menu > Add subject.
 The message automatically converts to an MMS message.
- 4. In the **To** field, enter the recipient's phone number or email address.

TIP: To add recipients from Contacts, tap **To** and enter at least two numbers of a contact number or two characters of a contact name. Then the corresponding contact will be listed for you to select.

- 5. Enter the subject.
- 6. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu** > **Attach**.
- 7. To insert text, tap **Type to compose**, then enter the message.
- 8. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu** > **Attach** > **Audio**.
- 9. Tap **Send**.

From Contacts

- 1. From the Home screen, tap **Contacts**.
- 2. Tap a contact and hold the contact that you want to send the text to.
- 3. Tap **Text contact**. The message window is displayed.
- Tap Menu > Add subject to convert to an MMS message. To enter a subject, tap Subject.
- 5. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu** > **Attach**.
- 6. To insert text, tap **Type to compose**, then enter your message with the on-screen keyboard.
- 7. To insert an audio file, tap **Menu** > **Attach** > **Audio**.
- 8. Tap Send.





From the Call log

- 1. From the Home screen, tap Contacts > Call log.
- 2. Tap and hold a call from the Call log.
- 3. Tap Send text message.
- Tap Menu > Add subject to convert to an MMS message. To enter a subject, tap Subject.
- 5. To insert a picture or video file, tap **Menu** > **Attach** > **Pictures** / **Videos**.
- 6. To insert an audio file, tap Menu > Attach > Audio.
- 7. To insert text, tap **Type to compose**, then enter your message using the on-screen keyboard.
- 8. Tap Send.


5.3 Voice message

This device can be used to send voice messages.

To create a voice message

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Messaging.

5.4 Email accounts


This device can send and receive emails just like you do with a computer. This device supports Internet email: an email account provided by an Internet Service Provider (ISP) or web-based email, such as Google Mail, Hotmail, Yahoo! Mail, etc.

Setting up an Internet email account







- 2. Select a picture that you want to attach from the gallery folders.

Receiving emails

Emails are automatically received in the Inbox folder when the device connects to the network.

To receive emails manually

Reading and replying to emails

The Inbox displays the email headers. When you open the email, it shows only a part of the message, unless it is a very short message. Download the email to view the complete content.



Quick search on your phone and the web

From the Home screen, you can search for information on your phone and on the web with **Google Search**.

To search for information by entering text

- 1. Tap the Google Search widget.
- 2. Enter the text that you are searching for in the **Quick** Search Box.

As you type, matching items on your phone and suggestions from Google web search are added to the list of previously chosen search results.

- If what you are searching for is in the list of suggestions, phone search results or previously chosen search results, tap it in the list.
 The item opens in the appropriate application, such as Contacts or Browser.
- 4. If what you are searching for is not in the list, tap in the Quick Search Box. The Browser opens, displaying the results of a Google search on the web.




Chapter 7: Using Bluetooth

Bluetooth modes

- On: Bluetooth is turned on. This device detects other Bluetooth devices, but this device is not visible to others.
- **Discoverable**: Bluetooth is turned on and this device is visible to other Bluetooth devices.
- Off: Bluetooth is turned off.

To turn Bluetooth on or off

- Tap Application drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap to check **Bluetooth** and activate.
- 3. To make your phone visible to others, tap **Bluetooth settings** and tick **Discoverable** to make this phone visible to other devices.



7.1 Connecting to Bluetooth devices

A connection to a Bluetooth device is called a partnership. You need to pair and create a partnership with a Bluetooth device to exchange information.


- Tap Application drawer > Settings > Wireless & networks.
- 2. Tap **Bluetooth settings** to view the menu options.
- 3. To search for a new device, tap Scan for devices.
- 4. Tap the device to connect.
- 5. Enter the **PIN** to start pairing, then tap **OK**.

NOTE: PIN of the device must be the same PIN on the other Bluetooth pairing device.

- 6. If you connect with an audio device which only supports HSP/HFP, "Connected to phone audio" will be displayed on the screen.
- 7. If you connect with an audio device which supports HSP/HFP/A2DP, "Connected to phone and media audio" will be displayed on the screen.

NOTE: Tap and hold the selected device to enter the device options menu.

NOTE: Once a partnership has been created, connecting to that device again will no longer require entering the password.



Chapter 8: Multimedia applications

8.1 Photos and videos

You can take photos and videos with the 5.0-megapixel camera in this device.

Taking a photo



Tap "+" or "-" to zoom the image in or out.

1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Camera**. The screen automatically switches to landscape view.

NOTE: To activate the camera at any time, press and hold the shutter button on the side.

- 2. Aim the device at the subject, then press the shutter button halfway down or tap and hold to focus.
- 3. The focus frame turns green to indicate that the focus is set, fully press the shutter button or tap to take the shot.

Recording video



- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Camcorder.
- 2. Aim the device at the subject.
- 3. To start recording, press the shutter button or tap
- 4. To stop recording, press the shutter button again or tap

Reviewing a photo

After taking a shot, a thumbnail image is displayed in the top-right corner of the screen.

- 1. Tap the thumbnail to view the image in full screen size.
- Tap DELETE to delete the picture and view the next picture.
- Tap SHARE to share the picture via Email or Messaging.
- Tap SET AS to set the image as Contact icon or Wallpaper.
- Tap DONE to save your settings.



Reviewing a video


After recording a video, the video thumbnail is displayed in the top-right corner of the screen.

- 1. Tap the video thumbnail to playback the video in full screen mode.
- Tap **DELETE to** delete the picture and view the next picture.
- Tap SHARE to share the picture via Email or Messaging.
- Tap PLAY to playback the video clip.
- Tap DONE to save your settings.



Configuring camera settings

On the camera screen, tap **Menu** > **Settings**. The Camera settings menu is displayed on the left of the screen. Swipe your fingers up and down to scroll the page for more options.



11.2 Changing basic settings

Date and time

To set the date and time

- 4. To adjust the time, tap the hour, minute, second or AM/PM field, and tap + or to increase or decrease the value.
- 5. To adjust the date, tap the month, day, or year field and tap + or to increase or decrease the value.
- 6. Tap **Set** to apply the values.



Setting alarms

You can set up three alarms on this device.

To set the alarm

- 1. Tap **Application drawer** > **Clock**.
- Under the Alarm clock tab, tap to select from the existing alarm clock settings or tap Menu > Add alarm to set up a new alarm.
- 3. Tap **Time** open a clock and set the time for the alarm. To enter the time numerically, tap the hour, minute or AM/PM field, and tap + or to increase or decrease the value.
- 4. Tap **Ringtone** to set up the preferred ringtone when your alarm sounds.
- 5. Tap **Vibrate** to enable/disable vibration when the alarm sounds.
- 6. Tap **Repeat** to select a day to sound the alarm. Tap **OK** to confirm.
- 7. Tap **Label** and enter an alarm description.
- 8. To turn on the alarm, tick **Turn on alarm**.

TIP: To sound an alarm even when this device is set to silent mode, tap **Menu** > **Settings** and tick **Alarm in silent mode**.



Display settings

The display settings of this device affect the battery and external power level.

To turn off backlight when the phone is idle

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In Display settings submenu, tap Screen timeout.
- 3. Select from the screen timeout list. Your setting is automatically saved.

To adjust brightness

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings** submenu, tap **Brightness** slider.
- 3. Drag the **Brightness** slider to adjust brightness settings.

To change the screen orientation

- 1. Tap **Application Drawer** > **Settings** > **Sound & display** to enter the submenu.
- 2. In **Display settings** submenu, tap **Orientation**.
- 3. Tick the box to switch the screen orientation automatically when rotating the device.

Ring settings

You can assign a ringtone and a ringtone type for various events such as an incoming call or new message received, for example.

To change the ringtone and ringtone type of an incoming call

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Sound & display.
- 2. In Sound settings submenu, tap Phone ringtone.
- 3. Select the desired ringtone from the lists.

Wireless & networks allows you to manage Wi-Fi, Bluetooth, flight mode and mobile networks.

- 2. To turn on or off **Wi-Fi**, **Bluetooth** or **Airplane mode**, simply tap their corresponding bars.
- 3. To change connection settings, tap the corresponding function settings, then select the setting to be changed.

11.4 Protecting your phone

You can protect this device from unauthorised users by requiring the PIN code or entering a password.

Enable or disable SIM card PIN

When PIN code is enabled, you are required to enter the PIN code before making a call.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Location & security.
- 2. In the SIM card lock submenu, tap Set up SIM card lock.
- 3. Tap **Lock SIM card** to use PIN to use the device. Tick to enable, untick to disable.
- 4. Enter the current PIN code.
- 5. To change the PIN code, tap **Change PIN**.
- 6. Enter the old PIN code.
- 7. Enter the new PIN code and confirm.

Enabling screen lock protection

When Screen lock is enabled, you are required to draw the pattern to unlock the screen.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Location & Security.
- 2. In the Screen unlock pattern submenu, tap Set unlock pattern.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to draw your own personal unlock pattern and tap **Continue**.
- 4. Redraw your unlock pattern again and tap Confirm.

11.5 Resetting the phone

You can reset your phone to its factory defaults.

- 1. Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Privacy.
- 2. In the **Personal data** submenu, tap **Factory data reset**.
- 3. Tap **Reset phone** to erase all data on your phone.

Chapter 12: Using the PC Tools application

The PC Tools application is a software application that enables you to change USB modes when your device is connected to a computer. Available modes are as follows:

- **USB mass storage**: Allows the computer to recognise your device as a USB mass storage device.
- Phone as modem: Allows you to use your device as a modem.
- Synchronization Tool: Allows you to sync your device with a computer.



12.1 Using the PC Tools application

Installing the driver

- 1. Turn on your device and connect it to your computer using the USB cable.
- 2. From the Windows desktop, double-click My Computer and locate the CD drive.
- 3. Browse and double-click **Setup.exe**.



4. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the driver installation.

Using your phone as a storage device

To browse and transfer video and still images to a computer, complete the following:

- 1. In the PC Tools application, select **USB mass storage**.
- 2. The Removable Disk window appears on the screen.



3. Locate the **DCIM** folder and double-click the **DCIM** folder to open it and find more folders.

Your recorded images and video clips will be inside these folders.

4. Copy and paste the image and video files to a folder on your computer.

Using your phone as a modem

This feature allows you to use your device as a modem to access the Internet.

- 1. Make sure that the Wi-Fi function on your device is set to *disable* mode.
 - Tap Application Drawer > Settings > Wireless controls. Turn off Wi-Fi mode (uncheck Wi-Fi).
- 2. In the PC Tools application, select **Phone as modem**.
- 3. Select APN.

You can edit the correct APN of your operator. Contact your network provider for more information.



4. Wait until Connecting to 3G_Modem process is completed.

A "3G Modem is now connected" message appears on the screen.

5. From the Windows desktop, double-click **Internet Explorer** or launch a web browser.

Using your phone to sync with a computer

This feature allows you to sync your device with a computer.

In the PC Tools application, select **Synchronization Tool**.



- Start Synchronization: allows you to initiate synchronization.
- **Synchronization Setting**: allows you to set the synchronization settings. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the settings.
- **Synchronization Summary**: displays the summary of the synchronization process.

Safety, regulatory & legal

Battery use & safety

Important: handle and store batteries properly to avoid injury or damage. Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

DON'Ts
