Avoid using your mobile phone in areas where it may cause interference or present a hazard. Follow local laws and regulations.




Avoid using your phone while driving. Your safety should always be your top priority.



Inserting a Micro-SIM card

Your phone supports only micro-SIM cards. Other sizes may not work properly. Contact your service provider to replace or purchase a new card. Power off your phone before installing or removing the micro-SIM card.



The dimensions (L x W) of a standard micro-SIM card is 15 mm x 12 mm (0.59 in. x 0.47 in.). Insert the micro-SIM card as shown in the following figure.



Inserting a microSD card

Your Mate supports Class 10 microSD cards. You can expand your phone's storage capacity with a microSD card. Follow the operations in the figure below to install a microSD card.



When installing a microSD card, insert the card fully into the slot until it clicks into place. To remove a microSD card:

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Storage**.
- 3. Touch Unmount SD card.
- 4. Push the microSD card against the slot to make it pop out, and then remove it.

Charging the battery

- A Your phone's built-in battery is not user-removable. To replace the battery, contact an authorized service center. Do not attempt to remove it yourself.
- Your phone supports fast charging, which requires the provided power adapter and USB cable. Using other power adapters or USB cables may cause repeated restarts, extended charging time, excessive heat, device damage, or in extreme cases, an explosion.

Use the provided USB cable and power adapter to connect your phone to a power outlet, or use the USB cable to connect your phone to a computer.



Battery indicator

The battery indicator shows your phone's battery level.

- Blinking red: The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is lower than 10%.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is higher than 10%.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost or already full.

Important information about the battery

• If the battery power is depleted, you may not be able to power on your phone immediately after you begin charging the battery. This is normal. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes before attempting to power on your phone.

- Rechargeable batteries have a limited number of charge cycles and may eventually need to be replaced. When the battery life becomes noticeably shorter, replace the battery.
- The time required to fully charge the battery depends on the ambient temperature and the age of the battery.
- If your phone is very low on power, it plays an alert tone and displays a message. If the battery level is extremely low, your phone automatically powers off.

Powering your phone on and off

- To power on your phone, press and hold 😃.
- To power off your phone, press and hold to display an option menu, and then touch **Power off**.
- If errors occur and you cannot power off your phone, press and hold U for 10 or more seconds to restart your phone.

Setting up your phone for the first time

When you use your phone for the first time, follow the onscreen instructions to set it up. When you power on your phone or open some applications for the first time, your phone walks you through basic operations. To read these instructions again, touch **Management**

> 🚺 from the home screen.

Getting started

Gestures



Touch: Tap an item once. For example, touch to select an item or open an application.

Touch and hold: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more. For example, touch and hold an application, widget, or blank area to display the related option menu.

Flick: Where applicable, swipe your finger in the direction you want the screen to move. For example, you can flick left or right across the notification panel to dismiss a notification.



Drag: Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. For example, you can re-arrange applications and widgets on the home screen this way.



Pinch: Pinch two fingers together to zoom out or stretch them apart to zoom in. For example, pinch together or apart to zoom in or out on a picture or web page.

Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen not only prevents your phone from carrying out undesirable operations when you are not using it, but also protects it from unauthorized use.

You can lock and unlock your screen in a number of ways. The pre-installed screen unlock method is used as an example in this section.

Locking the screen

- Press 🕛 to lock the screen.
- After being idle for a specified period of time, your phone automatically locks its screen.
- To set the screen lock method, touch is on the home screen. On the displayed General tab, touch Screen lock.

Unlocking the screen

- 1. If the screen is off, press to wake it.
- 2. Drag 👩 down to unlock the screen.



Drag 🔓 left or right towards an application to open it.

Getting to know your home screen

Your home screens are where you'll find your favorite widgets and all your applications. We did away with the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications. The default home screen is shown below.



1	Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
2	Display area: displays application icons, folders, and widgets.
3	Screen position indicator: shows the current screen's position.
4	Dock: displays your most common applications.
5	Navigation bar: displays virtual keys.

Switching between home screens

Running out of space on the home screen? Not to worry. Your phone lets you create more home screens for various application icons and widgets.

• Flick left and right across the screen to switch between the home screens.



• Pinch two fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to enter that particular home screen.



Taking a screenshot

Want to share an interesting scene in a movie or show off your new high score in a game? Take a screenshot and share away.

Press and the volume down button simultaneously to take a screenshot. Then, open the notification panel and touch \checkmark to share the screenshot. Screenshots are saved to the **Screenshots** album in **Gallery**.

Auto-rotate screen

Your phone features a tilt sensor. If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, the orientation of your screen will automatically change to landscape or portrait view. You'll also be able to enjoy tilt sensor-based applications, such as some downloaded racing games.

To quickly turn the auto-rotate screen function on or off, flick down from the status bar to

open the notification panel and touch 🔝 .

If the auto-rotate screen function is turned on and your screen is in landscape view, you can flick left from the right of the screen to display the navigation bar.


Hiding the navigation bar

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under DEVICE, touch Navigation bar.
- 3. Touch Hide navigation bar.

After the function is turned on, you can touch \checkmark to hide the navigation bar. To display it again, flick up from the bottom of the screen.

Using the notification panel

Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.



Touch to display the settings screen.

Touch **___** to delete all notifications.



Touch the switch shortcuts on the notification panel to turn functions on or off.



Touch an application to start it and flick left or right across a notification to dismiss it.

Using one-hand operations

Turn on one-hand operations to operate the large screen with ease using just one hand.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Touch One-hand operations.
- 3. Select where you wish to apply one-hand operations.

With **One-hand operations** enabled, use the arrow on either side of the screen to move the screen lock, dialer, or other object to the left or right.

Displaying suspend windows

Suspend windows let you operate multiple applications on the same screen.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Turn on Suspend button.
- 3. Touch **(** to bring up the suspend windows screen. Here, you can open preset applications on your phone or move some of them around.
- With Suspend button enabled, the suspend button will be displayed in most screens. To disable it, turn off Suspend button.

Turning on gloves mode

Gloves mode lets you perform touchscreen operations even while wearing gloves.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Touch the Gloves mode switch to enable gloves mode.

Accessing applications

Starting applications and switching between them

On the home screen, touch an application icon to open it.

To switch to another application, touch it is return to the home screen, and touch the icon of the application you wish to open.

Viewing recently used applications

To display the list of recently used applications, touch 🗖. You can then:

- Touch an application to start it.
- Flick left or right across an application to dismiss it.
- Touch 🇯 to clear the list.

Texting

Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can quickly enter text using the onscreen keyboard.

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- Touch a text box to bring up the onscreen keyboard.
- To hide the onscreen keyboard, touch \checkmark .


Selecting an input method

- On the text input screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Touch to select an input method.
- To change your phone's default input method, touch in the home screen. Then touch the All tab. Under PERSONAL, touch Language & input
 > Default to select an input method.





Editing text

Learn how to select, cut, copy, and paste text on your phone.



• Select text: Touch and hold the text to bring up . Then drag 🔘 and

to select more or less text, or touch **Select all** to select all text in a text box.

- Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- **Paste text**: Touch where you want to insert the text, drag \bigcirc to move the insertion point, and touch **Paste** to paste the text you copied or cut.



Configuring an input method

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Language & input.
- 3. Under **Keyboard & input methods**, touch the input method you wish to configure.

Personalizing your phone

Setting the theme

Your phone comes with a variety of themes. You can download more themes and mix and match theme elements to find a perfect fit.

Changing the theme

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🗰 .
- 2. Select a theme and touch **APPLY** to apply it.

Customizing a theme

- 1. From the theme grid, touch **CUSTOMIZE CURRENT THEME**.
- 2. From the element list, choose the element you wish to modify.
- 3. When you are done, touch SAVE AS MY THEME on the Customize screen.

The customized theme is then saved to the **Local** tab.

Changing the wallpaper

- 1. On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home
- **screen** dialog box.
- 2. Touch Wallpapers.
- 3. From the **Wallpapers** screen, you can set the following items:
 - Lock screen wallpaper: Set the wallpaper displayed on the phone lock screen.
 - Home screen wallpaper: Set the home screen wallpaper.
 - Shake to change: Change the home screen wallpaper by shaking your phone.
 - Random change: The home screen wallpaper changes randomly.

Setting the home screen transition effect

1. On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home screen** dialog box.

- 2 Touch **Transitions**
- 3. Select a home screen transition effect.

Organizing home screen widgets and application icons

Adding a widget to the home screen

- 1. On the home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Widgets.
- 3. Drag a widget from the screen's lower section to a screen thumbnail.
- 4. Touch \bigcirc to return to the home screen.

If the home screen doesn't have enough space, your phone will automatically create a new home screen to the original's right and place the widget on the new home screen.

Deleting an application icon or widget

On the home screen, touch and hold the application icon or widget you wish to delete until

👿 is displayed. Drag the unwanted application icon or widget to 🔳 to delete it.

Deleting an application icon uninstalls the application. When you delete an application icon, your phone prompts you to confirm the action. Touch OK to uninstall the application.

Moving an application icon or widget

You can re-arrange application icons and widgets to any fitting empty space on the home screen.

Organizing home screen icons using folders

Creating a folder on the home screen

- 1. On the home screen, drag an item onto another one to create a folder containing both of them.
- 2. You can then:
 - Touch the folder name to rename it.

• Touch + and add more items to the folder.

Removing an item from a folder

- 1. On the home screen, touch a folder.
- 2. Drag an item out from the folder to remove the item.
- A folder must contain at least two items; otherwise, the folder will automatically disappear.

Customizing Me Widget

Me Widget is a collage of popular widget units that is displayed on your home screen for your added convenience. They include contacts, music, clock, and weather.



Removing a widget unit

1. Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The

icon is displayed in the upper right corner.

- 2. Touch 💉 to enter editing mode.
- 3. Touch X for the widget unit you wish to remove.
- 4. When you are done, touch \checkmark .

Adding a widget unit

1. Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The

icon is displayed in the upper right corner.

2. Touch 💉 to enter editing mode.

3. Flick left or right across the widget unit list, select a widget unit and drag it to a blank area on Me Widget.



A Me Widget's size cannot be adjusted, so space is limited. If there is not enough space for a new widget unit, delete some existing ones first.

4. When you are done, touch \checkmark .

Moving a widget unit

Before you move a widget unit, make sure there is enough space to hold it in the new position.

1. Touch and hold Me Widget until your phone vibrates. Release your finger. The

icon is displayed in the upper right corner.

- 2. Touch 💉 to enter editing mode.
- 3. Touch and hold a widget unit until your phone vibrates, and drag it to the new position.
- 4. When you are done, touch \checkmark .

Customizing your home screens

Re-arranging home screens

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- 3. Touch and hold a home screen thumbnail until your phone vibrates, and drag it to the new location.

Adding a home screen

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the Set home screen dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- 3. Touch + to add a home screen.

Deleting a home screen

Only blank home screens can be deleted.

- 1. On a home screen, touch and hold a blank area to display the **Set home screen** dialog box.
- 2. Touch Thumbnails.
- 3. Touch \mathbf{X} to delete a home screen.

Customizing switch shortcuts on the notification panel

You can rearrange your switch shortcuts and move those you use most to top the list. Shortcuts on the top will be fully displayed on the notification panel.

- 1. Flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- 2. Flick left on the upper area. Touch 📑 to display the switch shortcut list.
- 3. Drag a switch shortcut to a new position in the list.

Managing profiles

Changing the profile

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛃 .
- From the profile list, select a profile and touch the button to its right to activate the profile.
- You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and change the profile using the switch shortcuts.

Adding a profile

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛃 .
- 2. Touch +.
- 3. Touch the text box and name the profile.
- 4. Touch Next.
- 5. Select actions for the profile and touch an action to configure its settings.
- 6. When you are done, touch **Done**.

Deleting a profile

To delete a custom profile, perform the following operations:

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛃 .
- 2. Touch > Delete.
- 3. Select the profiles you wish to delete.
- 4. Touch DELETE.
- 5. Touch **OK**.
- *i* Preset profiles cannot be deleted.

Setting tones

Setting the ringtone

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- Touch Phone ringtone and select either of the following options from the displayed dialog box:
 - Ringtone: choose from the default selection.
 - Local music: choose from the audio files you have saved to your phone.
- 4. Touch **OK**.

Changing message tone and other tones

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- 3. Touch Notification tone.
- 4. Select a tone type.
- You can configure the email notification tone only after you have set up an email account.
- 5. Select a tone.
- 6. Touch **OK**.

Changing the font size

1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.

- 2. Under DEVICE, touch Display.
- 3. Touch Font size and select a font size.

Setting the screen unlock method

.....

Face unlock

Enable your data service before using face unlock for the first time.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch **Screen lock** > **Face Unlock**.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to take a photo of your face.

Your phone will use face unlock as the primary unlock method.

5. Set a secondary unlock method.

If face unlock cannot recognize you (dim light, for example), follow the onscreen instructions to unlock your phone using the secondary unlock method.

To turn off face unlock, use the secondary unlock method to enter the **Screen lock** screen, and select another unlock method.

Unlocking the screen with a pattern

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > Pattern.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.
- If you draw incorrect patterns five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

Unlocking the screen with a PIN

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Screen lock > PIN.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock PIN.

After a screen unlock PIN is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

Unlocking the screen with a password

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch **Screen lock** > **Password**.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock password.
- 5. Repeat the password and touch OK.

After a password is set, you will have to enter it every time you want to unlock the phone screen.

If you enter incorrect passwords five consecutive times, the screen stops responding to further unlock attempts for 30 seconds. You will still be able to make emergency calls during this time.

Adjusting the screen brightness

-
- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. Touch Brightness.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, perform either of the following operations:
 - Select the **Automatic brightness** check box to have your phone automatically adjust its screen brightness based on the ambient light.
 - Drag the slider left to reduce the screen brightness or drag it right to increase the screen brightness.

You can also flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel and adjust the screen brightness using the switch shortcuts.

Calls

Smart dialing

In addition to standard call procedures, smart dialing lets you quickly find contacts by entering parts of their names or numbers.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 📞 .
- 2. Enter a phone number or the initials or first several letters of a contact name.

Matching contacts in your phone and phone numbers in your call log are then displayed in a list.

- 3. From the list, select the contact you wish to call.
- 4. To end the call, touch 🧖 .

Answering or rejecting a call

When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.



- Drag 🕓 right to answer the call.
- Drag 🕓 left to reject the call.
- Drag 🕓 up to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- On the dialer screen, touch > Settings > Quick responses to edit the message that will be sent.

Viewing the call log


- 1. On the home screen, touch 📞 to display your recent calls above the dialer.
- 2. Touch > Missed calls to view your missed calls.

What you can do during a call



Touch > I to place the current call on hold, and touch I again to resume the call.

Touch $\mathbf{I} > \mathbf{C}_{\mathbf{0}}$ to start a three-way call. Before you use three-way calling, make sure that you have subscribed to this service. For details, contact your service provider.






Touch $> \blacksquare$ to display a note.

8 Touch > 🗷 to display the contact list.

To return to the call screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel, and touch **Current call**.

Making a conference call

Conference calling with your friends, family, and co-workers is easy. Make or answer a call, and dial another number to add the second participant to your conference call.



- 1. Call the first participant.
- 2. When the call is connected, touch \bullet > \bigcirc to call the second participant. The first participant will be placed on hold.
- 3. When the second call is connected, touch $\,\,$ to start a conference call.
- 4. To add more people to the call, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- 5. Touch 🧖 to end the call.

Answering a third-party call

Before you answer a third-party call, make sure that you have turned on call waiting.

- 1. If a call comes in when you are already busy on the phone, drag Sright to answer the new call and place the first call on hold.
- 2. To switch between the two calls, touch $\, \mathcal{O}$.

Making emergency calls

In the event of an emergency, you will still be able to make emergency calls without the use of a SIM card. However, you must still be under the coverage area.

1. On the home screen, touch 📞 .

- 2. Enter your local emergency number and touch 📞 .

A Emergency calls are subject to cellular network quality, use environment, service provider policies, and local laws and regulations. Never rely solely on your phone for critical communications when emergencies occur.

Other call services

Your phone also supports other call functions, such as call forwarding, call waiting, and voicemail. Before you use these functions, make sure that you have subscribed to these services. For details, contact your service provider.

Enabling call forwarding

Too busy to answer all your calls with one phone? Forward them to another number and never miss an important call again!

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Call forwarding.
- 4. Select a forwarding mode.
- 5. Enter the phone number to which you wish to forward calls, and touch **Enable**.

Enabling call waiting

The call waiting function lets you answer another incoming call when you are already busy in a call and switch between the two calls

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Additional settings.
- 4. Touch Call waiting to enable call waiting.

Setting up your voicemail

Voicemail is your personal storage for missed calls, including the calls missed when you are busy on the phone or your phone is powered off.



Before you use voicemail, make sure you have subscribed to the voicemail service and obtained your voicemail number. For details, contact your service provider. You must also enable call forwarding and set all incoming calls to be forwarded to your voicemail.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Call.
- 3. Touch Voicemail > Voicemail settings > Voicemail number.
- 4. Enter your voicemail number, and touch **OK**.

To listen to your voicemail messages, touch and hold the **1** key on the dialer and follow the voice instructions.

Forget about lugging around business card holders. With your phone, you can easily store and manage your contacts in your new phone.

Creating a contact

- 3. Select one or more .vcf file.
- 4. Touch **OK**.

Importing contacts from a Bluetooth device

You can import contacts saved in a .vcf file from a Bluetooth device to your phone.

Before you import contacts, enable Bluetooth on your phone.

- 2. Touch > More > Manage contacts > Import via Bluetooth.

You phone then searches for available Bluetooth devices.

3. Touch the Bluetooth device with which you wish to pair your phone.

When the two devices are paired, your phone automatically imports the .vcf file from the other device.

Exporting contacts

Back up your contacts to a storage device in case you lose them during a system upgrade or by mistake.

A dialog box is then displayed, indicating the exported .vcf file name and its save location.





Photo taking screen





Taking a photo

- 3. Touch and hold ountil the viewfinder frame turns green, indicating that the camera is now focused.
- 4. Release your finger to take the photo.

Shooting a video

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔘 .

- 3. Touch 👁 to start recording.
- 4. Touch 👁 to stop recording.

Taking a panoramic photo

Are you still upset that your camera's view angle isn't wide enough to capture an incredible scene? Panorama mode is exactly the solution you need. You'll be able to piece together several photos and combine them into one seamless shot.

The camera automatically stitches the photos together to create one panoramic photograph.

Taking a group picture

Gallery

Gallery is your personal treasure box of sweet memories.

Viewing photos or videos

In your Gallery, photos and videos are stored in separate albums.



Checking the network connection

- Touch Access Point Names or Network operators to check network connection settings.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

 For an encrypted Wi-Fi network, enter the password when prompted.
- If Wi-Fi and mobile data are both enabled, your phone connects to the Wi-Fi network preferentially. When Wi-Fi becomes unavailable, your phone automatically switches to the mobile data connection.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network using the WPS

The Wi-Fi protected setup (WPS) lets you quickly connect to a Wi-Fi network. A safe connection is set up by pressing the WPS button or entering the PIN, instead of complex settings on the management software of Wi-Fi hotspots, such as wireless routers.

To use the WPS function and set up a Wi-Fi connection between your phone and a Wi-Fi hotspot, make sure that the Wi-Fi hotspot also supports the WPS.

Using the WPS button

Wi-Fi Direct lets you easily connect two devices and transmit or share data between them.

Connecting two devices using Wi-Fi Direct

- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch the Wi-Fi switch to turn on Wi-Fi.
- 3. On the Wi-Fi network list, touch
- 4. Touch Wi-Fi direct.

You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.

5. Select a device.

Sending a file using a Wi-Fi network

- 1. Touch and hold the file you wish to send.
- 2. From the displayed option menu, choose Share.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi.

4. Touch Other devices.

You phone then scans for available devices and displays them.

5. Touch the device you wish to send the file to.

The specific steps vary with the file type.

Receiving a file using a Wi-Fi network

When a file comes in, your phone displays the **File transfer** dialog box. To receive the file, touch **Accept**.

By default, received files are saved to the Wi-Fi folder in File Manager.

Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

Want to access the Internet from multiple devices when you are on the go? Use USB tethering or set your phone as a Wi-Fi hotspot to share its data connection with other devices.

USB tethering

You can share your phone's data connection with a computer using a USB cable.

To use USB tethering, you may need to install your phone's driver on the computer or establish a network connection, depending on your computer's operating system. If your computer runs Windows 7, Windows Vista, or a latest Linux operating system (such as Ubuntu 10.4), you can use your phone's USB tethering function without configuring any settings on the computer. If your computer runs an earlier version of Windows or another operating system, it will identify your phone and install its driver automatically.

1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.

- 2. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 3. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 4. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 5. Select the **USB tethering** check box to share your phone's data connection.
- You cannot use your phone's USB tethering function when the phone is in USB storage mode.

Bluetooth tethering

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with other devices using Bluetooth.

- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- 4. Select the **Bluetooth tethering** check box.
- 5. On the Bluetooth device you wish to use, search for and connect to your phone.

Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can also function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, sharing its mobile data connection.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- Touch Tethering & portable hotspot > Portable Wi-Fi hotspot settings > Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 4. Name the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5. Select an encryption mode.
- It is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2PSK to better secure the Wi-Fi network.
- 6. Set the key to the Wi-Fi hotspot.

When other devices want to access your phone's network, this key must be entered.

7. Select the Portable Wi-Fi hotspot check box.

- On the device you want to use, search for and connect to your phone's Wi-Fi network.
- To manage the devices allowed to connect to your phone, touch Manage allowed devices and clear Allow all devices to connect. To add an allowed device, touch Add device.


Controlling your data usage

Your phone's data usage control function lets you check and control your data usage.

Set a data usage cycle and a mobile data limit for this period and you will be notified when data usage reaches this limit. You can also query the data usage within a certain period of time or data traffic consumed by an application.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch More....
- 3. Touch Data usage.

On the **Data usage** screen, touch to open an option menu, from which you can:

- Turn data roaming on or off.
- Prevent background mobile data traffic.
- Turn automatic data synchronization on or off.
- Select the **Show Wi-Fi usage** check box. The **Wi-Fi** tab will be displayed. Touch this tab to view Wi-Fi data usage.
- Touch Mobile hotspots and select the Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots to prevent applications from accessing these networks in the background. If an application is downloading a large file using these networks, you will be notified.

Sharing data

Bluetooth

Your phone is Bluetooth-capable, allowing you to connect to other Bluetooth-enabled devices for wireless data transmission. When using Bluetooth, stay within 10 meters (33 feet) of other Bluetooth devices.

Turning on Bluetooth

1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.

2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.

When Bluetooth is turned on, your phone's name is displayed at the top of the Bluetooth screen. Touch the name to set your phone's visibility.

To rename your phone, touch **PRename phone**. When you are done, touch **Rename** to save the changes.

Searching for and pairing with other Bluetooth devices

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, enable Bluetooth on both devices and pair them with each other.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab
- 2. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Bluetooth.

Your phone then scans for Bluetooth devices in range.

3. From the list of detected Bluetooth devices, touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair with it.

To disconnect from a paired Bluetooth device, under **Paired devices**, touch $\frac{-1}{-1}$ > Unpair.

If a Bluetooth connection cannot be set up between your phone and another device, they may be incompatible, in which case you will need to pair with a different device.

Transferring files using Bluetooth

Bluetooth enables you to conveniently send photos, videos, and other files to your family and friends. You can share files with Bluetooth-enabled devices without an Internet connection

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔛 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to send.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Share > Bluetooth.
- 4. From the detected Bluetooth device list, select a device.

Receiving files using Bluetooth

1. When your phone receives a file transfer request, open the notification panel.

- 2. Touch Bluetooth share: Incoming file to display a file reception dialog box.
- 3. Touch Accept to start receiving the file.

When the file is received, you will receive a notification of a successful transfer. Open the notification panel to read the notification. By default, received files are saved to the **bluetooth** folder in **File Manager**.

DLNA

The Digital Living Network Alliance (DLNA) aims to implement intercommunication between computers and other electronic products through wired and wireless networks, providing users with seamless digital media services. DLNA enables users on the same Wi-Fi network to share multimedia files easily. Using DLNA, you can:

- Share multimedia files with your friends.
- Access multimedia files on other DLNA devices.
- Play multimedia files on other devices and control the playback.
- Before you use DLNA, make sure that your phone and other DLNA devices have connected to the same Wi-Fi network and DLNA is enabled on all devices.

On the home screen, touch **Tools** > 🔄 to display the DLNA screen. You can then share photos, videos, and songs with other DLNA devices, as well as view and download the multimedia files shared by other DLNA devices.

Connecting your phone to a computer

When you connect your phone to a computer using a USB cable, your phone will display a notification prompting you to select a connection type.

MTP mode

The Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) is used to transfer media files, such as pictures, songs, and videos, between your phone and a computer. Whether the MTP mode can be used depends on the version of Windows Media Player installed on the computer. Before you use this connection mode, make sure that Windows Media Player 10 or later has been installed.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the Media device (MTP) check box.
 The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

PTP mode

The Picture Transfer Protocol (PTP) is another method to transfer pictures and videos to your computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the Camera (PTP) check box.
 The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- After the driver is installed, follow the onscreen instructions on the computer to view or transfer files.

HiSuite mode

HiSuite mode lets you back up and restore data in your phone, manage applications and application data, and synchronize data, such as contacts, messages, pictures, songs, videos, and calendar, between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the HiSuite check box.
 The phone driver and HiSuite are then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. From the displayed HiSuite window, perform your operations accordingly.


Mass storage mode

In mass storage mode, you can use your phone as a USB mass storage device and transfer files between your phone and a computer.

- 1. Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- 2. On the phone home screen, flick down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Touch USB computer connection and select the USB mass storage check box.
 The phone driver is then automatically installed on the computer.
- 4. Transfer files between your phone and the computer.
- After file transmission, safely remove the device on the computer and disconnect it from the USB cable to prevent your data from being lost or corrupted.

Connecting your phone to a USB storage device

You can connect your phone to a USB storage device directly using the provided USB OTG cable to transfer data. Compatible USB storage devices include USB flash drives, card readers, and phones that work as USB mass storage devices.



To connect your phone to another phone, make sure that the phone you wish to connect to supports the USB mass storage function and has a microSD card installed. To establish the connection and read data stored on the microSD card:

- 1. Use a USB OTG cable and USB cable to connect the two phones.
- 2. Enable the USB mass storage function on the phone from which you wish to read data.
- 3. On your phone's home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 4. Touch **Storage** > **Mount USB storage**.
- 5. Read data from the microSD card of the other device.
- ▲ Do not remove a storage device from your phone before unmounting; otherwise, data may become corrupted. Before removing the device, touch

in the home screen. Then touch All > Storage > Unmount USB storage to unmount the USB device.

Your phone supplies power to USB storage devices. Certain phone models and mobile hard drives have relatively high rates of power consumption, meaning your phone may not be able to supply enough power for them to run properly.

File Manager

File Manager helps you manage files and applications in your phone's internal storage and microSD card. You'll be able to view, create, edit, delete, move, archive, compress, and decompress files.

Creating a folder

You can create folders to better manage the files and applications stored in your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

1. On the home screen, touch 🔛 .

- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch > New folder.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, name the new folder.
- 5. Touch Save.

Searching for a file

Too many files stressing you out? The search function helps you find what you need in no time.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔛 .
- 2. Touch Internal or SD card.
- 3. Touch > Search.
- 4. Enter part or all of the file name.
- 5. Touch $\,\,\mathbf{Q}\,$ in the lower right corner of the keyboard.

Copying or cutting a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔛 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to copy or cut.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Copy or Cut.

- 4. Select where you wish to paste the file.
- 5. Touch Paste.

Compressing or decompressing files

You can compress files into .zip files to save space or decompress .zip and .rar files.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔛 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file or folder you wish to compress.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Compress.
- 4. Choose the save path of the compressed file and name it.
- 5. Touch **OK**.

To decompress a file, touch and hold it and choose **Extract** from the displayed option menu.

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Renaming a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to rename.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Rename.
- 4. In the displayed dialog box, enter a new name for the file.
- 5. When you are done, touch OK.

Deleting a file

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch and hold the file you wish to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Delete.
- 4. Touch **OK**.

Creating a shortcut for a file or folder

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🛅 .
- 2. Touch the file or folder you wish to create a shortcut for.

3. From the displayed option menu, choose **Desktop shortcuts**.

Checking the memory status

Before you save large files to your phone's internal storage or microSD card, make sure there is enough space first.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🚞 .
- 2. Touch > Storage.
- 3. On the **Storage settings** screen, view the total and available spaces of your phone's internal storage or microSD card.

Managing applications

Downloading applications

A rich selection of applications are available to download through an application store, such as Google's **Play Store**. You can also connect your phone to a computer and transfer applications over that way.

Installing an application

- It is recommended that you use Play Store as your primary download source. Certain third-party applications from other sources may not be compatible with your phone.
- 1. On the home screen, touch Management > $\boxed{3}$.
- 2. Select the application you wish to install.
- 3. Touch > Install.
- 4. Touch Done.
- During the installation, a Install blocked message may be displayed. Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, touch

Security, and select the Unknown sources check box to allow installation of third-party applications. Then touch \frown to proceed.

Viewing applications

You can view detailed information about all applications installed on your phone.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Select the application you wish to view.

Uninstalling an application

You can remove unwanted applications to increase your phone's available storage.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Select the application you wish to uninstall.
- 5. Touch **Uninstall** > **OK**.
- Some pre-installed applications cannot be uninstalled.

Clearing the application cache

You can clear the application cache to free up the phone memory.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under APPS, touch Manage apps.
- 3. Flick to ALL.
- 4. Touch Clear cache.

Backup

Backup lets you back up your important data and restore them after a system upgrade or reset.

Backing up data to local storage

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Management** > **O**.
- 2. Touch Back up to SD card.
- 3. Select the data you wish to back up.
- 4. Touch Backup.
- 5. Enter a password when prompted.
- 6. Touch Backup.

By default, backup files are saved to the **HuaweiBackup** folder in **File Manager**.

Restoring data from local storage

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1. On the home screen, touch **Management** > **(** \bigcirc **)**.

- 2. Touch Restore from SD card.
- 3. From the backup file list, choose the file you wish to restore.
- 4. Enter the backup password.
- 5. Touch **OK**.
- 6. Touch Restore.

Google services

To use Google services, sign in with a Google account. If you don't have one, open a Google application and follow the onscreen instructions to create your Google account.

Gmail

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Gmail is Google's official email service. When you first use Gmail, emails on your web account will be synchronized to your phone.

Sending emails

- 3. Enter the recipient and subject and compose your message.
- 4. Touch >.

Checking your emails

1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > M to enter your mailbox.

If you have more than one Gmail account, select the one you wish to use.

- 2. From the email list, select the email you wish to read.
 - Touch **+** to reply to the sender.
 - Touch > **Reply all** to reply to all.
 - Touch > Forward to forward the email.

Talk

Talk is an instant chat application provided by Google. With **Talk**, you can reach friends using messages, or voice and video chats.

Adding a friend

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > talk.
- 2. Touch 🗣 .
- 3. Enter the email address of your friend.
- 4. Touch 🗸 .

If the recipient accepts your invitation, he or she will appear in your friend list.

Starting a conversation

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > talk .
- 2. From your friend list, touch the one you wish to talk to.
- 3. Compose your message.
- 4. Touch 🕨 .

Maps

Maps helps you find out where you are, shows you how to get to a destination, and displays real-time traffic. Satellite view is also available.

Turning on location services

Before you use **Maps** to search for a location, turn on your location services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Touch Location access.
- 3. Select the Wi-Fi & mobile network location and GPS satellites check boxes.

Searching for places of interest

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > 💱 .
- 2. Touch 🔍 .
- 3. Enter the location you wish to search for.

4. Touch $\ \ \mathsf{Q}$ in the lower right corner of the keyboard.

The search results are marked on the map by letters.

5. Touch a mark to see how to get there and view more details about the location.

Checking how to get to a place

- 1. When you browse a map, touch 🕐 .
- 2. Touch the first text box to enter the start point. Then, touch the second text box to enter the destination.
- 3. Select a transportation method: by car, public transportation, or foot.
- 4. Touch **Go**.

Available routes are then shown in a list.

- 5. Touch the route you prefer to display on the map.
- 6. To start a new search, touch > CLEAR MAP to clear the search results.

YouTube

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YouTube is Google's online video-sharing website, where you can search for, watch, and upload videos.

Searching for a video

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Google Apps** > 🛅 .
- 2. Touch 🔍 .
- 3. Enter the keywords.
- 4. Touch \bigcirc in the lower right corner of the keyboard.
- 5. From the search results, touch a video.

Sharing a video

From the video list, select the video you wish to share. Then, touch $\,<\!\!\!<\,$ and select a sharing method.

Play Store

Play Store is an application market provided by Google, where you can download applications and games.

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Installing an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🝺 .
- 2. Find the desired application.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download and install it.

Uninstalling an application

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🝺 .
- 2. Touch > My Apps.
- 3. From the application list, touch the application you wish to uninstall.
- 4. Touch **Uninstall** > **OK** to uninstall the application.

Basic utilities

Your phone comes with a variety of useful tools, such as **Calendar**, **Clock**, and **Calculator**, helping you keep yourself organized.

Calendar

Calendar is your personal assistant that helps you manage, arrange, and keep track of all important events.

Creating an event

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch > New event.
- 3. Enter event details, such as the event name, time, and location.
- 4. Touch 🗸 .

You can also touch any date on the calendar to create an event.

Viewing events

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- Touch the time in the upper left corner to switch between day, week, month, and agenda views.

The agenda view displays all your calendar events, which lets you know your schedule at a glance.

Sharing an event

You can share an event with your family and friends in a number ways, such as Bluetooth.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Open an event you wish to share.
- 3. Touch > Send event.
- 4. Select a sharing method and follow the onscreen instructions.

Synchronizing and viewing events

Calendar events in your accounts (such as an email account) can be synchronized to and viewed on the **Calendar** application.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 28.
- 2. Touch > Calendars to display.
- 3. Select the account whose calendar you wish to display.
- 4. Touch > Calendars to sync.
- 5. Select the account from which you wish to synchronize calendar events.
- 6. Touch **OK**.

Modifying calendar settings

Clock

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Clock lets you view the time around the world, use stopwatch or timer to keep track of time, or set alarms to wake you up in the morning.

4. Touch DONE.

() Enabled alarms will go off even when your phone is powered off.

Deleting an alarm

- 2. From the alarm list, touch and hold the alarm you wish to delete.
- 3. From the displayed option menu, choose Delete alarm.
- 4. Touch **OK**.

Configuring alarm settings

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🕒 .
- 2. From the alarm list, touch > Settings.
- On the alarm settings screen, set the ringing mode, snooze duration, and more.

Calculator

Calculator lets you make make simple or complex calculations.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** >
- On the Calculator screen, flick left or right to switch between the advanced and basic panels.

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Notes

Notes is a handy application that lets you record quick thoughts or important information.

1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > $\boxed{>}$.

- 2. Touch Add note.
- 3. Enter what you wish to record.
- 4. When you are done, touch 💾 .
- On the Notes screen, you can touch and select one or more notes to delete them at a time, or select All to delete all notes.

Weather

Weather provides you with the latest weather information for any city around the world. You can share weather information with your family and friends.

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Before you use **Weather**, turn on your phone's GPS and data service.

Adding a city

You can add cities you like to Weather and check their weather information.

1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > \bigcirc .

2. Touch 📕 > 🕂 .

Apart from your current city, you can add up to nine cities.

3. Enter a city name.

Matching cities are then displayed.

4. Select the city you wish to add.

Setting the default city

- 1. On the home screen, touch Tools >.
- 2. Touch 🔚 > 🏠 .
- 3. Touch the city you wish to set as the default city.

Deleting a city

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > \bigotimes .
- 2. Touch 📰 > 🧯 .
- 3. Select the city you wish to delete, and touch DELETE.

Updating weather

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > \bigcirc .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you wish to update.
- 3. Touch $\,\mathcal{C}\,$ to update the weather.
- You can also set Weather to automatic update mode. Touch => , select Auto update, and set Update interval. Your phone will then update the weather at the interval you set.

Sharing weather information

Your phone lets you send weather information as a text message to remind your family and friends of weather changes.

- 1. On the home screen, touch **Tools** > 🦰 .
- 2. Flick left or right to find the city whose weather you wish to share.
- 3. Touch \lt to display the messaging screen.
- 4. You can then:

- Enter a phone number.
- Touch **L** to select a contact.
- 5. Touch \triangleright to send the weather information to the recipient.

FM radio

Want to listen to your favorite broadcast programs? Open FM Radio anytime anywhere you like.



Accounts and sync

You can synchronize data on your phone, such as contacts, emails, and events, to and from the Internet.

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Adding an account

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under ACCOUNTS, touch Add account.
- 3. Select an account type.
- 4. Follow the onscreen instructions and enter your account information.
- Configure the account and set the type of data you wish to synchronize.
 When an account is set up, it will be shown in the ACCOUNTS section.
- The types of data you can synchronize to your phone vary with account type.

Deleting an account

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **ACCOUNTS**, select an account type.
- 3. Select the account you wish to delete.

Turning on data synchronization

Settings

Turning on or off airplane mode

Your phone's signal reception or transmission may interfere with an airplane's flight system. Power off your phone or switch to airplane mode when you are on a flight. In airplane mode, your phone's wireless features are disabled, but you can still listen to music or play games.

Use either of the following methods to turn on or off Airplane mode:

- Press and hold the power button. From the displayed option menu, choose **Airplane mode**.
- On the home screen, touch is then the All tab. Under WIRELESS & NETWORKS, touch Airplane mode.

When airplane mode is on, \checkmark appears in the status bar.

Tone settings

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- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Sound**.
- 3. From the settings screen, you can:
 - Touch Volume and drag the sliders to set the volume of music, ringtone, message notification tone, and more.
 - Touch **Vibration** to set whether your phone vibrates when you have an incoming call, message, email, event, and more.
 - Touch Silent mode to turn silent mode on or off.
 - Touch Phone ringtone to select a ringtone.
 - Touch Notification tone to select a tone for messages, emails, events, and more.
 - Touch Dolby Digital Plus Settings to turn the Dolby sound effect on or off.
 - Touch **System** to turn the notification tone or vibration on or off when you touch or lock the screen, take a screenshot, dial a number, and more.

You can adjust the volume from the home screen or most applications, such as call, music, and video.

Display settings

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Display**.
- 3. On the settings screen, you can:
 - Touch Color temperature to adjust the screen color temperature. To manually adjust the color temperature, clear the Default check box.
 - Touch **Brightness** to set the screen brightness. To manually adjust the brightness, clear the **Automatic brightness** check box.
 - Touch Wallpaper to set the lock screen and home screen wallpapers.
 - Touch Auto-rotate screen to turn the screen auto-rotate function on or off.
 If this function is turned on, your screen's orientation will automatically change with the way you hold your phone when you perform certain operations, such as browsing a web page, viewing a picture, or writing a message.
 - Touch Smart backlight to turn smart backlight function on or off. If this function is turned on, your phone automatically adjusts the screen brightness based on the content displayed on it.
 - Touch **Sleep** to set a screen timeout period. If idle for the specified period, your phone automatically locks its screen to save battery power.
 - Touch Font size to change the display font size.

Turning on the power manager

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **DEVICE**, touch **Power Manager**.
- 3. From the settings screen, you can:
 - Touch Intelligent mode to save power and maximize the standby time.
 - Touch Normal mode to enable normal power saving mode.

 Touch Optimum performance to have your phone work in its best performance mode without any power saving operations.

Setting the date and time

By default, your phone relies on the network-based date and time. You can also manually set the date and time.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🙆 then the All tab.
- 2. Under SYSTEM, touch Date & time.
- 3. From the settings screen, you can:
 - Clear the **Automatic date & time** check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the network date and time.
 - Clear the **Automatic time zone** check box to stop your phone from automatically obtaining the network time zone.
 - Touch Set date and flick up and down to set your phone's date.
 - Touch Set time and flick up and down to set your phone's time.
 - Touch Select time zone and select the time zone from the list. Scroll up or down to view more time zones.
 - Select or clear the **Use 24-hour format** check box to switch between the 12-hour and 24-hour formats.
 - Touch Select date format to select how you wish the date to be displayed.

Changing the system language

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under **PERSONAL**, touch Language & input.
- 3. Touch Language.
- 4. From the list, choose a language.

Modifying location service settings

You can modify your phone's location service settings for more convenient positioning and navigation services.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Location access.
- 3. From the settings screen, you can:
 - Touch Access my location to enable your phone to use your location information.
 - Touch **GPS satellites** to have your phone obtain your location information from GPS satellites.
 - Touch Wi-Fi & mobile network location to have your phone obtain your location information from a Wi-Fi network or mobile data connection.

Setting the PIN of your SIM card

The personal identification number (PIN) is delivered with your SIM card. If you enable the PIN protection function for your SIM card, you will need to enter the PIN each time you power your phone on.

Before you perform the following operations, make sure that you have obtained your SIM card's PIN from your service provider.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Security.
- 3. Touch Set up SIM card lock.
- 4. Select the Lock SIM card check box.
- 5. Enter the PIN.
- 6. Touch **OK**.

▲ If you incorrectly enter the PIN a specified number of consecutive times, the PIN is blocked and the phone prompts you to enter the PIN unblocking key (PUK). If you incorrectly enter the PUK a specified number of consecutive times, the SIM card will be disabled permanently. For details about the maximum retry attempts for the PIN and PUK, contact your service provider.

Restoring factory settings

Restoring your phone to its factory settings erases all your personal data from the phone, including your email accounts, system and application settings, and installed applications.

A Back up important data on your phone before you restore factory settings.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under PERSONAL, touch Backup & reset.
- 3. Tap Factory data reset > Reset phone > Reset phone.

The phone will restore its factory settings and restart.

Online update

Once in a while, new updates for your phone will be available online. You will receive a notification when updates are available. Before updating, make sure that your phone has enough storage space for the update package.

To update manually, on the home screen, touch is > **About phone** > **System updates** to check for updates and follow the onscreen instructions to update your phone online.

All your personal data may be erased during a system update. It is recommended that you back up important data before updating your phone.

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Accessibility

You can turn on or off preset or installed accessibility features.

- 1. On the home screen, touch 🔯 then the All tab.
- 2. Under SYSTEM, touch Accessibility.
- 3. Select the features you wish to turn on or off.

How can I save battery power?

- When you do not need Internet access, open the notification panel and touch to turn off your mobile data connection.
- When you do not need wireless data services, such as GPS, Bluetooth, or Wi-Fi, open the notification panel, and touch 🔍 , 🔝 , or 🖻 to turn off these services.
- Touch 🔯 > All > Display to reduce the screen brightness and screen timeout period. Press 🕛 to turn off the screen when your phone is not in use.
- Close applications that are not in use.
- Decrease the tone volume

How can I free up additional phone memory?

- Move files and email attachments to a microSD card.
- Open the browser and delete locally cached content.
- Uninstall applications you no longer use.
- Restore your phone to its factory settings.

How can I use a microSD card to import contacts from another phone?

Your phone supports contact files in .vcf format only.

- 1. Save the contacts you wish to import as a .vcf file and save the file to a microSD card.
- 2. Insert the microSD card into your phone. Touch File Manager then SD card to find the .vcf file.
- 3. Touch the .vcf file. The phone displays a message asking whether you wish to import the contacts.
- 4. Touch **OK** to import the contacts.



G Compatibility issues may occur with .vcf files created by other phones and certain contact information may be lost during the import.

How can I set a song as my ringtone?

In **Music**, touch and hold the song you wish to set as the ringtone. From the displayed option menu, choose **Set as ringtone**.

How can I disable the Auto-rotate screen function?

On the home screen, touch O then All > Display, and clear Auto-rotate screen.

How can I set a screen unlock pattern?

On the home screen, touch 0 then **General** > **Screen lock** > **Screen lock** > **Pattern**, and follow the onscreen instructions to set a screen unlock pattern.

How can I switch the input method?

When you write text, open the notification panel and touch **Choose input method** to select an input method.

How can I stop the song playing in the background?

Open the notification panel, touch the playing song to display the music playback screen, and stop the playback.

How can I return to the call screen?

To return from another screen during a call, open the notification panel and touch the ongoing call.

How can I move an application icon on the home screen?

On the screen, touch and hold the application icon you wish to move and drag it to a new location.

How can I hide the onscreen keyboard?

Touch \smile to hide the keyboard.

How can I forward a message?

Touch and hold the message you wish to forward, and choose **Forward** from the displayed option menu.

How can I restart my phone?

Press and hold , and touch **Restart** > **OK** to restart your phone.

How can I remove the black borders that sometimes appear on the bottom of third-party applications?

When some third-party applications are running and you touch \checkmark to hide the navigation bar, a black border appears on the bottom of the screen. This is caused by the application's layout limitations. For most cases, simply hide the navigation bar and re-open the application to remove the border.

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
