Highlights

New camera modes

Perfect selfie

Set your own custom beauty settings for facial enhancement and beautifying effects when you take photos in **Beauty** mode.

- 2 Touch \equiv > \bigotimes > Perfect selfie.
- 3 Enable Perfect selfie.
- **4** Touch **Perfect selfie** and take three self-portrait shots.
- i On the camera settings screen, you can touch **Perfect selfie** > **Edit personal info** to update your personal information.
- **5** On the **Set beauty effects** screen, adjust your beauty settings, and then touch \checkmark .
- **6** In **Beauty** mode, touch **(a)** to take photos.

Light painting mode

Capture trails of light by using slow shutter speeds.

- **2** Touch **Light painting** and select a preset effect.
- **3** Touch **o** to begin shooting. When the desired exposure time is reached, touch to complete the shot.

Time-lapse mode

Use this mode to create an accelerated video of a slow-changing scene, such as the sunset or sunrise.

- 2 Swipe left or right to select **Time-lapse**.

- **3** Touch **o** to start recording.
- **4** Touch to stop recording. The captured video will be played back at an accelerated pace.

Wi-Fi+

If you enable Wi-Fi+, your phone will monitor the quality of available networks and automatically switch to the network with the best signal and speed.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Settings and then go to the All tab.
- 2 Under Wireless & networks, touch More.
- 3 Touch LINK+>Wi-Fi+.
- 4 Turn on Wi-Fi+ settings.

Thumb mode

Thumb mode makes it easier to use phones with large screens and quickly share QR contact cards with friends.

One-hand layout


- 1 On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2 Under All, touch One-hand UI > One-hand layout.
- **3** Enable **One-hand layout**. You can then swipe the virtual navigation bar to either side to change the screen layout, bringing everything within reach.



Moving the screen down

On the contacts, dialer, messaging, or email screen, if you can't reach items near the top of the screen, touch the upper half of the screen and drag down and release (after 1 second) to shift the entire interface down closer to your thumb.

From the dialer, contacts or messaging screen, drag down and then release to display your personal QR contact card. Your friends can scan this to obtain your phone number instantly.



Safe

The safe is a secure storage location where you can store your important and private data.

Enabling the safe

- **1** On the home screen, touch Files.
- **2** Under **Categories** or **Local**, touch **Safe**.
- 3 Touch Enable.

Follow the onscreen instructions to enter your password and set up the security question, and then touch **Done**.

Adding files to the safe

- On the home screen, touch Files.
- Under **Categories** or **Local**, touch **Safe**.
- Enter the password, and then touch **Done**.
- 4 Touch Add.
- Follow the onscreen instructions and select which files you want to add to the safe.
- Touch **ADD** to add the selected files to the safe.


Locking and unlocking the screen

Locking the screen

- Method 1: Press the power button to manually lock the screen.
- Method 2: After being idle for a specified period of time, the screen will lock itself automatically.

Unlocking the screen

When the screen is off, press the power button to turn it on. Slide your finger in any direction to unlock the screen.



Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

- **1** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2** Under **Shortcuts**, touch and hold $\widehat{\mathfrak{F}}$ to enter the Wi-Fi settings.
- **3** Turn on Wi-Fi. Your phone then scans for available Wi-Fi networks and lists them on the screen.
- **4** Select the Wi-Fi network you want to connect to. If the Wi-Fi network is encrypted, enter the password when prompted.

Turning on mobile data

- **1** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2** Under **Shortcuts**, touch (1) to enable mobile data.
- i When you don't need to access the Internet, disable mobile data to save battery power and reduce data usage.

Connecting your phone to a computer

Use a USB cable to connect your phone to a computer. Follow the onscreen instructions and select a connection mode to transfer photos, videos, songs, and other files between your phone and computer.

Photos	Read, manage, and transfer multimedia files in your phone storage. For details, see Connecting in picture transfer mode.	
Files	Read, manage, and transfer files in your phone storage. For details, see Connecting in media transfer mode.	
USB drive	If you have a microSD card installed, you can use your phone as a USB storage device, read data on the microSD card, and transfer data to and from a computer. For details, see Connecting in USB flash drive mode.	

Importing contacts from your old phone

You can import contacts from your old phone in any of the following ways:

SIM card	Copy your contacts on your SIM card to your new phone. For details, see Importing contacts from a SIM card.
Storage device	If your old phone has a microSD card slot, export the contacts in your old phone to a microSD card as a vCard file, and then import the contacts to your new phone. For details, see Importing contacts from a storage device.
Bluetooth	Enable Bluetooth on both your old and new phones, and import your contacts using Bluetooth. For details, see Importing contacts from a Bluetooth device.
Backup	If your old phone supports Backup, back up your contacts, and restore them to your new phone. For details, see Backup.
Computer	Synchronize your contacts from your old phone to a computer, and use phone management software on the computer, such as HiSuite, to synchronize them to your new phone.
Other accounts	 Install social network applications and synchronize contacts from your social network accounts. Log in to your Exchange account and synchronize your contacts.

Touchscreen gestures



Touch: Tap an item once. For example, touch to confirm an action or open an application.



Touch and hold: Touch and leave your finger on the screen for 2 seconds or more. For example, touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to enter editing mode.



Swipe: Move your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen. For example, you can swipe left or right under **Notifications** in the notification panel to dismiss a notification. Swipe horizontally or vertically to transition through home screens, scroll through a document, and more.



Drag: Touch and hold an item and then move it to another position. For example, you can rearrange applications and widgets on the home screen this way.



Pinch two fingers out: Spread two fingers apart on the screen. For example, pinch two fingers out to zoom in on a picture or web page.



Pinch two fingers together: Pinch two fingers together on the screen. For example, pinch two fingers together to zoom out on a picture or web page.



Pinch three fingers together: On the home screen, pinch three fingers together to display screen thumbnails.

Motion control

Motion control lets you control your phone using simple motions and gestures. For example, mute the phone by turning it over or raise the phone to your ear to answer and make calls guickly.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2 Under All, touch Motion control.
- **3** On the **Motion control** screen, select an option, and select a motion to enable it.
 - Flip: Mute sounds and stop vibration from incoming calls, alarms, and timers.



• **Pick up**: Pick up your phone to reduce the ring volume of incoming calls, alarms, and timers.



• Raise to ear: When a call comes in, answer the call by raising your phone to your ear. Similarly, from the call or contact details screen, raise your phone to your ear to call the corresponding number.



• **Shake**: Touch and hold a blank area on the home screen to enter editing mode. Shake your phone to organize your icons.



• **Tilt**: In home screen editing mode, touch and hold an icon or widget and tilt your phone to the left or right to move the icon or widget to the next screen.

Navigation bar settings

- **1** On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2 Under All, touch Navigation bar.
- **3** Select one of the virtual navigation bars to customize your navigation bar. If you select a navigation bar containing $\overline{\psi}$, you can touch $\overline{\psi}$ to quickly open your notification panel.
- This feature is only available on phones with virtual navigation keys.

Home screen

Your home screens are where you can find your favorite widgets and all your applications. We did away with the application list to give you a more convenient and direct path to your applications.



- Status bar: displays notifications and icons. Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- Display area: displays application icons, folders, and widgets.
- 3 Screen position indicator: indicates which home screen is displayed.
- Dock: displays frequently used applications.
- S Navigation bar: displays virtual keys

Switching between home screens

Swipe left or right to view the extended home screen. Touch **Home** to return to the default home screen.

Swipe left or right to view all home screens.



Automatic screen rotation

If you rotate your phone when browsing a web page or viewing a photo, the screen orientation changes automatically between landscape and portrait mode. This feature allows you to enjoy tilt-controlled applications, such as racing games.

- **1** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2** Under **Shortcuts**, touch **Auto-rotate** to enable or disable screen rotation.

Organizing applications and widgets on the home screen


The following operations allow you to organize your applications, widgets, or folders:

- Adding a widget: On the home screen, pinch two fingers together to enter home screen editing mode. Touch Widgets and select a widget. The widget will be added to a blank area on the home screen.
- i You must have enough space on the home screen to add the widget. If there is not enough space, add another home screen or free up some space on the current screen.
- Moving an application or widget: On the home screen, touch and hold an
 application icon or widget. You can then drag the application icon or widget to the
 desired location.

- **Deleting an application or widget**: On the home screen, touch and hold the application icon or widget you want to delete until is displayed. Drag the unwanted application icon or widget to i.
- **Creating a folder**: On the home screen, drag an icon on top of another icon to create a folder containing both applications. To rename the folder, open the folder and then touch and hold the folder name.
- Hiding application icons: Place two fingers on the home screen and pinch out. Touch
 + , select the application icons you want to hide, and then touch OK. Applications will not appear on the home screen after they have been hidden.

Managing home screens

On the home screen, pinch three fingers together to display the home screen thumbnails.



- **Setting the default home screen**: Touch \bigcirc at the bottom of the screen to set the current home screen as the default home screen.
- **Moving a home screen**: Touch and hold the home screen. Drag the home screens to adjust their positions.
- Adding a home screen: Touch + to add a home screen.
- ullet Deleting a home screen: Touch imes to delete a blank home screen.

Notifications

Status indicator

The status indicator on your phone indicates the following status information:

- Blinking red: The battery level is low.
- Steady red (when charging): The battery level is low.
- Steady yellow (when charging): The battery level is medium.
- Steady green (when charging): The battery is almost full or already full.
- Blinking green: There are unread messages or notifications.

Notification panel

Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel. Swipe left or right to switch between the notification and shortcut tabs.



- Touch to view the notification details and swipe left or right across a notification to dismiss it.
- Clear all notifications.
- **3** Enable or disable automatic screen brightness.
- Touch the shortcut switches to enable or disable the corresponding functions.

Lock screen notifications

Use the lock screen notifications feature to place new messages, missed calls, and other notifications on the lock screen.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under General, touch Screen lock & passwords.
- **3** Touch the **Show detailed notification info** switch to enable lock screen notifications.

Accessing applications

Opening and switching between applications

On the home screen, touch an icon to open the corresponding application.

To switch to another application, touch Home to return to the home screen, and touch the icon of the application you want to open.

ightharpooling If you have installed many applications on your phone and you can't find the application you want quickly on the home screen, swipe down and search for the application in the search bar.

Viewing recently used applications

Touch Recent to display the list of recently used applications. Then you can:



- Touch a thumbnail to open the corresponding application.
- Swipe left or right to view recently used applications.
- Swipe up on a thumbnail to close the corresponding application.
- Swipe down on a thumbnail to display \bigcirc at the top of the thumbnail and lock the corresponding application. Swipe down on the thumbnail again to unlock the application.
- Swipe up from the bottom of the screen until is displayed to close all applications in the list. Locked applications will not be closed.

Personalizing your phone

Changing the home screen style

You can choose from the standard and simple home screen styles as desired.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch Home screen style.

- Touch **Standard home** to switch from the simple home screen to the standard home screen.

Changing the theme

- **1** On the home screen, touch **2** Themes.
- **2** Swipe left or right to browse themes. You can:
 - Select a theme.
 - Touch and customize the theme style, wallpaper, font, and more.
- 3 Touch 🗸
- i You can update your themes or download new ones online by turning on mobile data or connecting to a Wi-Fi network.

Changing the wallpaper

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under General, touch Wallpaper.
- **3** On the **Wallpaper** screen, you can:
 - Touch Lock screen wallpaper to set the lock screen wallpaper.
 - Touch **Home screen wallpaper** to set the home screen wallpaper.
 - Touch the Shake to change switch to make the home screen wallpaper change when
 you shake your phone.
 - Touch the Random change switch to make the home screen wallpaper change automatically at periodic intervals.

Changing the ringtone

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under General, touch Sound.
- **3** Touch **Default notification tone**, and then choose one of the following tabs:

- Ringtone: Choose from the preset ringtones.
- Music: Choose from the audio files stored on your phone.
- If your phone has dual SIM support, you can set different ringtones for each SIM card.
- **4** Touch ✓.

Changing the font size

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under General, touch Font.
- 3 Touch Font size.
- **4** Follow the onscreen instructions to select the font size.

Entering text

Switching between input methods

Your phone comes with multiple text input methods. You can choose one of them to input text.

- **1** On the text input screen, swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel.
- **2** Under **Notifications**, touch **Select input method**.
- **3** Select an input method.
- To change your phone's default input method, touch Settings on the home screen. Under All, touch Language & input > Default keyboard, and then select an input method.

Huawei Swype input method



- Slide across letters to enter a word.
- 2 Switch between lowercase and uppercase letters.
- 3 Touch and hold to access input method settings.
- Enter numbers and symbols.
- 5 Touch and hold to view more language input options.
- 6 Switch to voice input.

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- Touch to delete the character preceding the cursor.
- Touch and hold to delete multiple characters preceding the cursor.

Android input method



- Touch to switch between lowercase and uppercase letters.
 - Touch and hold or quickly touch twice to enable caps lock.
- Enter numbers and symbols.

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- Touch to enter a comma.
- Touch and hold to open the input options menu.
- Touch to enter a space.
 - Touch and hold to choose another input method.
 - Touch to enter a period.
- Touch and hold to enter symbols.
 - Touch to delete the character preceding the cursor.
- Touch and hold to delete multiple characters preceding the cursor.
- Switch to voice input.

Editing text

You can select, cut, copy, and paste text on your phone.



- **Select text**: Touch and hold the text to bring up \(\backsquare \). Then drag \(\backsquare \) or \(\backsquare \) to select more or less text, or touch **Select all** to select all text in a text box.
- Copy text: Select text and touch Copy.
- Cut text: Select text and touch Cut.
- Paste text: Touch and hold where you want to insert the text and then touch Paste.



Calls and contacts

Making a call

Smart dialing

Smart dialing lets you quickly find contacts by entering parts of their names or numbers.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, enter the initials or first few letters of a contact's name, or part of the contact's phone number. Any matches in your contacts list or call log are then displayed above the dialer.
- **3** From the list, select the contact you want to call. If your phone has dual SIM support, touch **U** or **U** to make a call.
- **4** To end the call, touch .

Making a call from Contacts

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- 2 Under Contacts, touch the contact you want to call.
- **3** Touch the contact number. If your phone has dual SIM support, touch or to make a call.

Making a call from the call log

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, from the call log, select the contact or number you want to call. If your phone has dual SIM support, touch or to make a call.

Speed-dialing

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, touch \equiv > **Speed dial settings**.


- **3** Touch \bigoplus . Choose a contact from the list and assign a number key to the contact.
- The number key **1** is the default key for voicemail. It can't be set as a speed-dial number.
- **4** On the dialer, touch and hold the number key assigned to a contact to quickly call the contact.
- if your phone has dual SIM support, on the dialer, touch and hold a number key assigned to a contact, and then touch \(\mathbb{U}\) or \(\mathbb{C}\) to quickly call the contact.

Making an international call

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- 2 On the dialer, touch and hold 0 to enter +.
- **3** Enter the country or region code, area code, and phone number in sequence.
- **4** Touch **\(\ldots**\). If your phone has dual SIM support, touch **\(\ldots\)** or **\(\ldots\)**.
- i When roaming, you can select the phone number of a stored contact to call the contact directly.

Answering or rejecting a call

? When a call comes in, you can press the volume button to mute the ringtone.



- Drag Oright to answer the call.
- Drag O left to reject the call.

- Drag Oup to reject the call and send the caller a message.
- i On the dialer screen, touch \equiv > Call settings > Reject calls with SMS to edit the message that will be sent.

In-call menu



- Place the current call on hold. To resume the call, touch | again. (Make sure your carrier supports this feature.)
- 2 Mute the call so that the other party can't hear you.
- 3 Start a three-way call. (Make sure your carrier supports this feature.)
- Activate the speaker for a hands-free call.
- **6** End the current call.
- Open the dialer.
- Display your contacts.
- 8 View your notes.

During a call, touch the OHome or Return to hide the in-call menu. To return to the menu, swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel, and then touch Current call.

Answering a third-party call

- i Before you answer a third-party call, make sure that you have enabled call waiting. For details, contact your carrier.
- **1** If a call comes in when you are already in another call, drag ight to answer the new call and place the first call on hold.
- 2 Touch \Leftarrow to switch between the two calls.

Making a conference call

It's easy to set up a conference call using the multi-party call feature on your phone. Call one number (or receive a call), and then call another number to add it to the conference call.

- Conference calling may not be supported by all mobile plans. Please make sure you have subscribed to this service. For details, contact your carrier.
- **1** Call the first participant.
- **2** When the call is connected, touch + to call the second participant. The first participant will be placed on hold.
- **3** When the second call is connected, touch \updownarrow to start a conference call.
- **4** To add more people to the call, repeat steps 2 and 3.
- **5** Touch **?** to end the call.

Using the call log

Records of all outgoing, incoming, and missed calls are stored in your call log.

Adding a contact from the call log

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, touch (i) next to the number you want to add.
- **3** Touch + or $\stackrel{\circ}{\sim}$.
- ? You can also touch and hold the number you want to add, and then touch **Create** new contact or Save to existing contact.

Deleting call records

- 1 On the home screen, touch **Dialer**.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, you can:
 - Touch and hold a contact name or phone number, and then touch Delete entry to delete the call record.
 - Touch \equiv > **Delete call log** to delete multiple records simultaneously.

Turning on pocket mode

If you're ever worried about missing important calls when your phone is in your pocket or bag, try turning on pocket mode. Once enabled, pocket mode will gradually increase the ringtone volume and vibration intensity for incoming calls.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, touch \equiv > **Call settings**.
- 3 Turn on Pocket mode.

Call settings

Enabling call forwarding

If you aren't able to take calls on your phone, you can forward them to another number.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- 2 Under Dialer, touch \equiv > Call settings.
- **3** Touch **Call forwarding**. If your phone has dual SIM support, touch **Call forwarding** under **Card 1 settings** or **Card 2 settings**.
- **4** Select a forwarding mode.
- **5** Enter the phone number to which you want to forward calls, and then touch **Enable**.

Enabling call waiting

The call waiting function allows you to answer an incoming call during an active call, and freely switch between the two.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Dialer.
- **2** Under **Dialer**, touch \equiv > **Call settings**.
- **3** Touch **Additional settings**. If your phone has dual SIM support, touch **Card 1 settings** or **Card 2 settings** and then **Additional settings**.
- **4** Touch the **Call waiting** switch to enable this function.

Managing contacts

Creating a contact

- **2** Touch +.
- **3** Select a location to save the contact from the options menu.
- **4** Enter the contact name, phone number, and other details.
- **5** Touch ✓.

Editing a contact

- 2 Touch and hold the contact you want to edit, and then touch Edit.
- **3** Edit the contact information.
- **4** Touch ✓.

Deleting contacts

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Contacts**.
- 2 Touch $\equiv >$ Delete.
- **3** Select the contacts you want to delete or touch **Select all** to select all contacts.
- **4** Touch 🛅 .
- 5 Touch Delete.

Searching for a contact

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Contacts**.
- **2** Enter the contact name or initials. Matching contacts are displayed as you type.

Importing or exporting contacts

Your phone supports .vcf contact files. .vcf is a standard file format for storing contact information, including names, addresses, and phone numbers.

Importing contacts from a storage device

- **1** On the home screen, touch **1 Contacts**.
- 2 Touch = > Import/Export > Import from storage.
- **3** Select one or more .vcf files, and then touch **OK**.

Importing contacts from a SIM card

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Q** Contacts.
- 2 Touch = > Import/Export > Import from SIM card. If your phone has dual SIM support, you can choose whether to import from SIM 1 or SIM 2.
- **3** Select the contacts you want to import or touch **Select all** to select all contacts, and then touch $\boxed{-}$.
- **4** Choose the location to where you want to import contacts. Your phone will automatically import the contacts.

Importing contacts from a Bluetooth device

- 2 Touch = > Import/Export > Import from another phone.
- 3 Select Supports Bluetooth and then touch Next.
- **4** Turn on Bluetooth on the device from which you want to import contacts and set the device to be visible to other Bluetooth devices.
- **5** Touch **Next**. Your phone then turns on Bluetooth and scans for Bluetooth devices.
- **6** Touch the Bluetooth device from which you want to import contacts.

Once the two devices are connected, your phone will automatically import contacts from the other Bluetooth device.

Importing contacts using Wi-Fi Direct

- 1 On the home screen, touch Contacts.
- **2** Touch \equiv > Import/Export > Import from another phone.
- **3** Select **Import via Wi-Fi Direct** and then touch **Next**. Your phone then prompts you to turn on Wi-Fi and scans for Wi-Fi Direct devices.
- **4** Touch the Wi-Fi Direct device from which you want to import contacts.

Once the two devices are connected, your phone will automatically import contacts from the other device.

Exporting contacts to a storage device

- **1** On the home screen, touch **L** Contacts.
- 2 Touch = > Import/Export > Export to storage.
- 3 Touch Export.
- **4** Choose where you want to export the contacts from and touch **OK**.

The exported .vcf file is saved to the root directory of your phone's internal storage by default. You can open Files to view the exported file.

Exporting contacts to a SIM card

- **1** On the home screen, touch **L** Contacts.
- 2 Touch = > Import/Export > Export to SIM card. If your phone has dual SIM support, you can choose whether to export to SIM 1 or SIM 2.
- **3** Select the contacts you want to export or touch **Select all** to select all contacts, and then touch \Box .
- 4 Touch OK.

Sharing contacts

You can add important messages to your favorites. Your favorites messages will not be deleted when you delete conversations.

Setting up an email account

When adding an account, contact your email service provider if you are unsure about the settings required.

- **4** Follow the onscreen instructions to configure your account. The system will then automatically connect to the server.

Once your account is set up, Inbox will be displayed.

After adding an email account, in **Inbox**, touch \equiv > **Settings** > **Add account** to continue adding other accounts.

Adding an Exchange account

Exchange is an email system developed by Microsoft for enterprises. Some email service providers also provide Exchange accounts for individuals and families.

When adding an account, contact your email service provider if you are unsure about the settings required.

- 2 Touch Exchange.
- **3** Enter your email address, domain name, user name, and password, and then touch **Next**
- **4** Follow the onscreen instructions to configure your account. The system will then automatically connect to the server.

Once your Exchange account is set up, ${\bf Inbox}$ will be displayed.

- 1 In Inbox, swipe down to refresh your email list.

Account settings

Switching between email accounts

Removing an email account



Camera and gallery

Capture screen

- Apply filter effects.
 - Touch an object on the screen to focus the camera on it.
- Spread two fingers apart to zoom in or pinch them together to zoom out.
- Switch between the rear and front cameras.

Taking a photo

- HDR: Enhance a photo taken under insufficient or excessive lighting conditions.
- All-focus: You can re-adjust the focal point of photos taken in this mode at a later time.

- **Best photo**: Your phone takes several photos in rapid succession and automatically picks the best one for you.
- Watermark: Add various watermarks to your photos.
- Audio note: You can record a brief audio clip after you take a photo.
- Audio control: Touch ۞ and enable this mode under **Settings**. You can issue voice commands to have your camera take photos for you.
- **Timer**: Touch and enable this mode under **Settings** to set a countdown timer for taking a photo.
- **Touch to capture**: Touch ۞ and enable this mode under **Settings**. Touch the screen to take a photo.
- Capture smiles: Touch ② and enable this mode under Settings. The camera will automatically take a photo when it detects a smile.
- **Object tracking**: Touch and enable this mode under **Settings**. Touch an object on the screen. Your camera will track and stay focused on this object.
- **Ultra snapshot**: Touch and enable this mode under **Settings**. When the screen is off or locked, frame the object you want to capture and press the volume down key twice to take a photo.

Taking a panoramic photo

- **2** Touch \equiv > Panorama to switch to panorama shooting mode.

Adding watermarks to photos

Shooting a video

- **4** While recording, touch an object or a position on the screen to focus on it. Touch to pause recording, and touch b to resume.
- **5** Touch **l** to stop recording.
- *i* While recording, you can touch ot take a still photo.

Video shooting modes

? Your phone may not feature all of these shooting modes.

- Beauty mode: Automatic facial enhancement during recording.
- **Object tracking**: Touch an object on the screen. Your camera will track and stay focused on this object as you're shooting the video.
- Stabilizer: Minimizes camera shake during recording.

Camera settings

On the capture screen, touch \equiv > \bigotimes to configure the following settings:

- **GPS tag**: Display the location where the photo or video was taken.
- **Preferred save location**: Set the default save location for your photos and videos.
- Perfect selfie: Enable this function in Beauty mode for automatic facial recognition and customized portrait enhancement.
- **ISO**: Set a photo's ISO. Increasing the ISO can reduce blurring caused by dark conditions or movement.
- White balance: Adjust a photo's white balance. Adjust the white balance according to the brightness of the surroundings.
- Image adjustment: Adjust exposure compensation, saturation, contrast, and brightness.

Gallery

Viewing photos

1 On the home screen, touch <a>Gallery.

2 You can then:

- Select the **Photos** tab and view photos in a timeline.
- Select the **Photos** tab, select **Map** and view photos grouped according to location.
- Select the **Albums** tab and view photos grouped by album.

Playing a slideshow

Editing a photo

You can adjust a photo's brightness, saturation, size, and more. You can also use the facial enhancement feature to enhance portrait photos in a variety of different ways.

 - Touch (2) to add a watermark to the photo.
 - Touch $^{\circ}$ to add a label to the photo.

Deleting a photo

Sharing photos and videos

You can share your photos or videos in various ways.

Listening to music

Touch the playing song to enter the main playback interface.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network using WPS

Wi-Fi protected setup (WPS) helps make it easier to connect your phone to a Wi-Fi network. Simply press the WPS button or enter the PIN to connect your phone to a Wi-Fi router that supports WPS.

Sharing your phone's mobile data

Wi-Fi hotspot

Your phone can function as a Wi-Fi hotspot for other devices, sharing its mobile data connection.

- 2 Under Wireless & networks, touch More.
- **3** Touch **Tethering & portable hotspot** > **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot**.
- **4** Turn on the Wi-Fi hotspot.
- 5 Touch Configure Wi-Fi hotspot.
- **6** Set the Wi-Fi hotspot's name, encryption mode, and password. Then touch **Save**.
- 1 It is recommended that you set the encryption mode to WPA2 PSK for better security.

USB tethering

You can share your phone's data connection with a computer using a USB cable.

Depending on your computer's operating system, you may need to install phone drivers on the computer or establish a network connection in order to use USB tethering.

- **1** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2** On the home screen, touch **Settings** and then go to the **All** tab.
- 3 Under Wireless & networks, touch More.

- 4 Touch Tethering & portable hotspot.
- **5** Touch the **USB tethering** switch to share your mobile data connection.
- ? You can't use your phone's USB tethering function when the phone is in USB mass storage mode.

Bluetooth tethering

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with other devices using Bluetooth.

- 1 On the home screen, touch Settings and then go to the All tab.
- 2 Under Wireless & networks, touch More.
- 3 Touch **Tethering & portable hotspot**.
- **4** Touch the **Bluetooth tethering** switch to share your mobile data connection.

Transferring data using Bluetooth

Turning on Bluetooth and pairing your phone with another Bluetooth device

- **1** On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2 Under All, touch Bluetooth.
- **3** Touch the **Turn on Bluetooth** switch to turn on Bluetooth. Your phone will automatically search for and display available Bluetooth devices.
- **4** Touch a device and follow the onscreen instructions to pair it with your phone.

To unpair the two devices, touch (i) next to the paired device, and then touch **Unpair**.

Renaming your phone

By default, your phone model is used as your phone name when Bluetooth is turned on. You can change the name to make it easier to recognize.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch Bluetooth.

- 3 Touch Device name.
- 4 Rename the phone and touch OK.

Sending a file using Bluetooth

To exchange data with another Bluetooth device, turn on Bluetooth on both devices and make sure they are both discoverable.

Touch and hold the file you want to send, and then touch **Share** > **Bluetooth**. Your phone will automatically search for and display available devices. Select the receiving device.

Receiving a file using Bluetooth

When your phone receives a file transfer request, a **File transfer** dialog box will be displayed. Touch **Accept** to start receiving the file. Open the notification panel and touch **Notifications** to check the file transfer progress.

By default, received files are saved to the bluetooth folder in Files.

Transferring data using Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct allows two devices to connect to each other for data transmission without an access point.

Connecting two devices using Wi-Fi Direct

- Before connecting, ensure that you have enabled Wi-Fi Direct on both devices.
- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All. touch Wi-Fi.
- 3 Turn on Wi-Fi.
- **4** Touch **Wi-Fi direct** to enable Wi-Fi Direct. Your phone will search for available devices.
- **5** Select the device to which you want to connect.

Sending a file using Wi-Fi Direct

Touch and hold the file you want to send, and then touch **Share > Wi-Fi Direct**. Your phone will automatically search for and display available devices. Select the receiving device.

Receiving a file using Wi-Fi Direct

When a file transfer request is made using Wi-Fi Direct, the **File transfer** dialog box will be displayed. Touch **Accept** to receive the file. Open the notification panel and touch **Notifications** to check the file transfer progress.

By default, received files are saved to the Wi-Fi Direct folder in Files.

Transferring data between your phone and computer

Connecting in picture transfer mode

The Picture Transfer Protocol (PTP) is an image transfer protocol that can be used to transfer images between your phone and computer, making sharing easier.

- **1** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel. Set **USB connected** to **Photos**. Any drivers required will be installed automatically on the computer.

Once the drivers are installed, double-click the new drive icon that appears on your computer to view the images stored on your phone.

Connecting in media transfer mode

The Media Transfer Protocol (MTP) is a communication protocol that can be used to transfer files between your phone and computer. Before using MTP, make sure you have Windows Media Player 11 or later installed on your computer.

- **1** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel. Set **USB connected** to **Files**. Any drivers required will be installed automatically on the computer.

Once the drivers are installed, double-click the new drive icon that appears on your computer to view the files stored on your phone. You can browse multimedia content on your phone easily using Windows Media Player.

Connecting in USB flash drive mode

If you have a microSD card in your phone, you can use your phone as a USB flash drive and transfer files between the microSD card and a computer.

- **1** Use a USB cable to connect your phone to the computer.
- **2** Swipe down from the status bar to open the notification panel. Set **USB connected** to **USB drive**. Any drivers required will be installed automatically on the computer.

Once the drivers are installed, the computer will recognize the phone as a USB flash drive. Double-click the new drive icon that appears on your computer to view the files on your phone's microSD card.

Transferring data between your phone and a USB storage device

You can connect your phone to a USB storage device directly using a USB OTG cable. This lets you transfer data without using a computer. Compatible USB storage devices include USB flash drives, card readers, and phones that have a microSD card inserted.

Use only USB OTG cables certified by Huawei. To purchase a cable, please contact your device vendor.



To connect to another phone, make sure the phone has a microSD card inserted. Then perform the following steps:

- **1** Connect the two phones using a USB OTG cable and USB cable.
- **2** Set the USB connection method on the other phone to **USB drive**.

3 On your phone, touch Solution > Local > USB to read data from the other phone's microSD card.

To read data from other USB storage devices, such as USB flash drives or card readers, connect the two devices using a USB OTG cable, and then touch > Local > USB on your phone.

Multi-screen display

You can push photos, videos, or games from your phone to a large screen, such as a TV, to view them more conveniently and share with your family and friends.

If your TV supports HDMI, you can buy an Android TV Box or other similar wireless device to use this feature.

Open your notification panel. Under **Shortcuts**, touch $\stackrel{\square}{\hookrightarrow}$, select the receiving device, and start the multi-screen display.

For details about connecting your phone to an Android TV Box, see the Android TV Box manual.

Managing applications

Downloading applications

Applications can be downloaded through a variety of channels, including:

- An app market on your phone.
- Web pages using the phone browser.
- Web pages using your computer.
- Third-party app download software on your computer.

Installing an application

- **1** On the home screen, touch Files.
- 2 Under Categories, touch Applications > Apps.
- **3** In the **Apps** list, touch the application you want to install and follow the onscreen instructions.
- During the installation, the **Install blocked** message may be displayed. Read the message carefully. If you want to continue with the installation, follow the onscreen instructions to allow the installation of applications from unknown sources.

Sharing an application

Phone Manager

Phone Manager is Huawei's unique system management application that lets you better protect and manage your phone. With Phone Manager, you can:

- Scan for problems and clean system trash to optimize your system.
- Enable power saving mode to maximize your phone's standby time.
- Block unwanted calls, messages, and notifications.
- The availability of Phone Manager features and services may depend on your country/

region or carrier.

Optimizing the system

Scan for problems and optimize the system to keep your phone running smoothly.

On the home screen, touch **Phone Manager**. Then you can:

- Touch **Scan** or **Touch to scan**. You can view your phone's running status, clean system trash, optimize the system, and eliminate security threats.
- Touch Phone accelerator to display running applications and close those that are not needed.
- Touch Storage cleaner to scan the cache, clean system trash, and remove infrequentlyused applications and installation packages.

Power saving

- 1 On the home screen, touch Phone Manager.
- **2** Touch **Power saving** to check your phone's power consumption and extend your phone's standby time. You can switch to different power saving modes as required.

Harassment filter

On the home screen, touch Phone Manager. Then you can:

- Touch Harassment filter to set a blacklist to block unwanted messages and calls.
- Touch Notification center to block unwanted push notifications from the specified applications.
- Enable **Do not disturb**. Your phone will ring only when you receive calls from allowed contacts. Tones and vibrations for other calls, messages, and notifications will be disabled.

Security and privacy

On the home screen, touch **Phone Manager**. Then you can:

 Touch App lock to enable app lock and set the password for accessing locked applications.

Managing data usage

- 1 On the home screen, touch Phone Manager.
- **2** Touch **Traffic manager** to configure data plan limits and warnings, and view detailed data usage information.

Calendar

Calendar helps you to manage your daily life and work. For example, you can plan your daily schedule in advance and view information about public holidays. If you have saved your contacts' birthdays, the calendar will automatically create birthday reminders.

Creating an event

- 1 On the home screen, touch 28 Calendar.
- **2** Touch +.
- **3** Enter the event details, such as the event name, start and end time, location, and how often it repeats.
- **4** Touch ✓.

Viewing the calendar

- 1 On the home screen, touch (28) Calendar.
- **2** On the **Calendar** screen, you can:
 - Select Month, Week, and Day to switch between the month, week, and day views.
 - In month, week, or day view, swipe left or right to change the month, week, or day that is displayed.

Viewing global holidays

- **2** Touch \equiv > Subscribe.
- 3 Touch Add > Global holidays.

4 Touch the switch next to the country whose holidays you want to view. Your phone will automatically access the Internet and download the country's holiday information.

Setting alternative calendars

- 1 On the home screen, touch 28 Calendar.
- **2** Touch \equiv > Subscribe.
- 3 Touch Add > Local calendar.
- **4** Choose an alternative calendar. Your phone will automatically download data for that calendar

Synchronizing calendars

- 1 On the home screen, touch 28 Calendar.
- **2** Touch \equiv > Calendars to display.
- **3** Select the account whose calendar you want to display.
- 4 Touch \equiv > Calendars to sync.
- **5** Select the account and synchronize its calendar.

Clock

Alarm

- 1 On the home screen, touch Clock.
- 2 Under Alarm, you can:
 - Add an alarm: Touch + and set the alarm time, ringtone, repetitions, and more.
 Touch \(\sqrt{} \) to apply the settings.
 - Enable or disable an alarm: Touch the switch next to an alarm to enable or disable it.
 - Configure alarm settings: Touch ② to configure the snooze duration, silent mode settings and what volume keys do when an alarm goes off.
 - Delete an alarm: Touch and hold the alarm you want to delete, and then touch lacktriangle .

World clock

- 1 On the home screen, touch Clock.
- 2 Under World clock, you can:
 - Add a city: Touch + . Enter a city name or select a city from the city list.
 - Set your time zone: Touch to set your home time zone and system date and time.
 - Remove a city: Touch Edit cities. Touch next to the city you want to remove,
 and then touch .

Stopwatch

- 1 On the home screen, touch Clock.
- **2** Under **Stopwatch**, touch to start timing.
- **3** While timing, touch 🔘 to count laps.
- **4** Touch (I) to pause the stopwatch.

When the stopwatch is paused, touch \Box to clear all stopwatch records.

Timer

- **1** On the home screen, touch **(a)** Clock.
- **2** Under **Timer**, drag the dot clockwise along the wheel to set the countdown time.
- Touch to set a tone for the timer.
- **3** When you are done, touch \bigcirc to start the timer.

Weather

Weather allows you to check the current weather and multi-day forecast for your location and many other destinations around the world.

Checking the weather

- **3** Touch $\[\ \ \]$ to view more detailed weather information.

Removing cities

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **Weather**.
- $oldsymbol{2}$ Touch $oldsymbol{\equiv}$, and then touch and hold the city you want to remove. Select $oldsymbol{\ominus}$.
- **3** Touch ✓.

Updating the weather

- 1 On the home screen, touch Tools > Weather.
- **2** Swipe left or right to find the city whose weather you want to update.
- **3** Swipe down from the top of the screen to manually update the weather.
- i You can also configure automatic weather updates. Touch \equiv > \circledcirc . Enable the **Auto update** switch, and then configure the **Update interval**. Your phone will then update weather data at the scheduled interval.

FM Radio


Connect a headset to the phone first because the FM radio uses the headset as its antenna.

Searching for stations

- 1 On the home screen, touch Tools > FM Radio.
- **2** Touch $\equiv > \mathbf{Q}$. The FM Radio will automatically search for and save stations it finds.
- i Your phone will automatically search for and save stations the first time you open the FM radio.

Listening to FM radio

On the home screen, touch **Tools** > **FM Radio**.



- Turn the speaker on or off.
- Turn the FM radio on or off.
- Return to the previous station.
- 4 Skip to the next station.

- **5** Add the current station to your favorites.
- Enter the settings interface: view and search the station list, view your favorite stations, and set a timer to turn off the FM radio automatically.

Phone settings

Turning on location services

Make sure you have turned on location services before using a map or navigation application.

- **1** On the home screen, touch Settings.
- 2 Under All, touch Location access.
- **3** Touch **Access my location** to enable your phone's location services.
- **4** Touch **Location mode**. Then you can:
 - Touch **High accuracy** to locate your position using GPS, Wi-Fi, and mobile data.
 - Touch **Battery saving** to locate your position using Wi-Fi and mobile data.
 - Touch **Device only** to locate your position using GPS.

Modifying sound settings

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- **2** Under **All**. touch **Sound**.
- **3** On the **Sound** screen, you can:
 - Touch Volume and drag the sliders to adjust the volume of music, ringtones, notification tones, alarms, calls, and more.
 - Touch Silent mode to turn silent mode on or off.
 - Touch Vibrate in silent mode to enable or disable vibration when your phone is in silent mode.
 - Touch Phone ringtone to select a ringtone. If your phone has dual SIM support, you
 can set different ringtones for each SIM card.

- Touch Vibrate when ringing to enable or disable vibration when your phone rings.
 If your phone has dual SIM support, you can apply different vibration settings for each SIM card.
- Touch **Default notification tone** to set a notification tone.
- Under System, touch the switches to enable or disable the notification tone or vibration when you touch or lock the screen, dial a number, and more.

Modifying display settings

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch Display.
- **3** On the **Display** screen, you can:
 - Touch **Wallpaper** to set the lock screen and home screen wallpapers.
 - Touch Font size to change the display font size.
 - Touch Font style to change the display font style.
 - Touch **Daydream** to enable or disable the screen saver. If this function is enabled, the screen saver will run automatically while your phone is being charged.
 - Touch Indicator light to enable or disable the blinking indicator when you receive notifications.
 - Touch **Display carrier name** to display or hide the carrier name in the status bar when the screen is unlocked.
 - Touch **Display network speed** to display or hide the current network speed.
 - Touch **Brightness** to adjust the screen brightness.
 - Touch Sleep to set when your screen turns off. When idle for a specified period, the screen locks automatically to save battery power.
 - Touch Auto-rotate screen to set whether your screen auto-rotates. If this function is
 turned on, your screen's orientation will change automatically with the way you
 hold your phone when you perform certain actions, such as browsing a web page,
 viewing a picture, or writing a message.

Enabling one-hand UI

One-hand UI makes using a phone with a large screen much easier.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch One-hand UI.
- **3** On the **One-hand UI** screen, you can:
 - Go to the **One-hand layout** screen and enable **One-hand layout**. Swipe left or right on the virtual navigation bar to reposition the screen to either side.

Touch-disable mode

You can use this feature to prevent unintended operations on the screen when your phone is in your pocket or bag.

- 2 Under Smart assistance, touch More.
- **3** Enable **Touch-disable mode**. When this feature is enabled, the touchscreen will be disabled when the top of the screen is covered. The touchscreen will function normally as soon as the top of the screen is no longer being covered.

Turning on gloves mode

Gloves mode lets you perform touchscreen operations even when you're wearing gloves.

A personal identification number (PIN) is delivered with your SIM card to protect your phone data. If you enable SIM card lock, you must enter the PIN each time you turn on your phone.

Before you perform the following operations, make sure you have obtained your SIM card PIN from your carrier.

- 6 Touch Change SIM PIN to change the PIN.

There is usually a limit to the number of unsuccessful PIN code attempts. If this limit is reached, you must enter a Personal Unblocking Key (PUK), which can be obtained from your carrier. There is also a limit to the number of unsuccessful PUK code attempts. If this limit is reached, your SIM card will be permanently disabled. For details about these limits, contact your carrier.

Synchronizing email

- **3** Touch \equiv and select **Auto-sync data**. Follow the onscreen instructions and touch **OK** to enable data synchronization.
- **4** On the **Accounts** screen, select an account type.
- **5** Select the account from which you want to synchronize data.
- **6** Touch the **Sync Email** switch to synchronize from the account you selected.

Restoring factory settings

- Restoring your phone to the factory settings will erase all personal data from your phone storage, including account information, system and application settings, and downloaded applications. Back up important data on your phone before restoring factory settings.

Privacy protection

You can prevent other users from accessing your private content. Enable privacy protection and set two different screen unlock passwords, one for yourself and one for quests.

Enabling privacy protection

- 1 On the home screen, touch Settings.
- **2** Under **All**, touch **Security**.
- **3** Touch **Privacy protection** > **Let's start**.
- **4** Select a password type.
- **5** Follow the onscreen instructions to enter the owner password and guest password.

After privacy protection is enabled, entering the owner password allows access to all the content on your phone. Entering the guest password allows access to unprotected content only.

Setting private information

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch Security.
- **3** Touch **Privacy protection**.
- 4 Enter the owner password, and then touch Next.
- **5** Under **Set private data**, set your private contacts, albums, and applications.

Disabling privacy protection

- **3** Touch **Privacy protection**.
- **4** Enter the owner password, and then touch **Next**.
- **5** Disable **Privacy protection**.
- After privacy protection is disabled, the owner password will function as the screen unlock password and the guest password will become invalid.

Accessibility

Your phone is equipped with accessibility features for visually impaired users. You can enable or disable these features as needed, such as zoom gestures and enlarged font size.

- **1** On the home screen, touch **Settings**.
- 2 Under All, touch Accessibility.
- **3** Select the accessibility features you want to enable.

Safety information

This section contains important information about the operation of your device. It also contains information about how to use the device safely. Read this information carefully before using your device.

Electronic device

Do not use your device if using the device is prohibited. Do not use the device if doing so causes danger or interference with other electronic devices.

Interference with medical equipment

- Follow rules and regulations set forth by hospitals and health care facilities. Do not use your device where prohibited.
- Some wireless devices may affect the performance of hearing aids or pacemakers.
 Consult your service provider for more information.
- Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm be

- If the device screen is broken in a collision, immediately stop using the device. Do not touch or attempt to remove the broken parts. Promptly contact an authorized service center.
