The information provided in this document supersedes the general safety information in user guides published prior to December 1, 2002.

### 3.1 Exposure To Radio Frequency (RF) <br> Energy

Your phone contains a transmitter and a receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your phone transmits.
Your Motorola phone is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

### 3.2 Operational Precautions

To assure optimal phone performance and make sure human exposure to RF energy is within the guidelines set forth in the relevant standards, always adhere to the following procedures.

### 3.2.1 External Antenna Care

Use only the supplied or Motorola-approved replacement antenna. Unauthorised antennas, modifications, or attachments could damage the phone.

Do NOT hold the external antenna when the phone is IN USE Holding the external antenna affects call quality and may cause the phone to operate at a higher power level than needed. In addition, use of unauthorised antennas may result in non-compliance with the local regulatory requirements in your country.
3.2.2 Phone Operation

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone as you would a wireline telephone.

### 3.2.3 Body-Worn Operation

To maintain compliance with RF energy exposure guidelines, if you wear a phone on your body when transmitting, always place the phone in a Motorola-supplied or approved clip, holder, holster, case, or body harness for this phone, if available. Use of accessories not approved by Motorola may exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. If you do not use one of the body-worn accessories approved or supplied by
Motorola, and are not using the phone held in the normal use position, ensure the phone and its antenna are at least 1 inch ( 2.5 centimetres) from your body when transmitting.

### 3.2.4 Data Operation

When using any data feature of the phone, with or without an accessory cable, position the phone and its antenna at least 1 inch ( 2.5 centimetres) from your body.

### 3.2.5 Approved Accessories

Use of accessories not approved by Motorola, including but not limited to batteries and antenna, may cause your phone to exceed RF energy exposure guidelines. For a list of approved Motorola accessories, visit our website at www.Motorola.com.
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### 3.3 RF Energy Interference/Compatibility

Note: Nearly every electronic device is susceptible to RF energy interference from external sources if inadequately shielded, designed, or otherwise configured for RF energy compatibility. In some circumstances your phone may cause interference.

### 3.3.1 Facilities

Turn off your phone in any facility where posted notices instruct you to do so. These facilities may include hospitals or health care facilities that may be using equipment that is sensitive to external RF energy.

### 3.3.2 Aircraft

When instructed to do so, turn off your phone when on board an aircraft. Any use of a phone must be in accordance with applicable regulations per airline crew instructions.

### 3.3.3 Medical Devices

## Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 6 inches ( 15 centimetres) be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker.
Persons with pacemakers should:

- ALWAYS keep the phone more than 6 inches ( 15 centimetres) from your pacemaker when the phone is urned ON.
- NOT carry the phone in the breast pocket
- Use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimise the potential for interference.
- Turn OFF the phone immediately if you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.


## Hearing Aids

Some digital mobile phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

## Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from RF energy. Your GP may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

### 3.4 Use While Driving

Check the laws and regulations on the use of phones in the area where you drive. Always obey them.
When using your phone while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving and to the road
- Use hands-free operation, if available.
- Pull off the road and park before making or answering a call if driving conditions so require


### 3.5 Operational Warnings

### 3.5.1 For Vehicles With an Air Bag

Do not place a phone in the area over an air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Air bags inflate with great force. If a
phone is placed in the air bag deployment area and the air bag inflates, the phone may be propelled with great force and cause serious injury to occupants of the vehicle.

### 3.5.2 Potentially Explosive Atmospheres

Turn off your phone prior to entering any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, unless it is a phone type especially qualified for use in such areas and certified as "Intrinsically Safe." Do not remove, install, or charge batteries in such areas. Sparks in a potentially explosive atmosphere can cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.
Note: The areas with potentially explosive atmospheres referred to above include fuelling areas such as below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, areas where the air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres are often but not always posted.

### 3.5.3 Blasting Caps and Areas

To avoid possible interference with blasting operations, turn OFF your phone when you are near electrical blasting caps, in
a blasting area, or in areas posted "Turn off electronic devices." Obey all signs and instructions

### 3.5.4 Batteries

Batteries can cause property damage and/or bodily injury such as burns if a conductive material such as jewellery, keys, or beaded chains touch exposed terminals. The conductive material may complete an electrical circuit (short circuit) and become quite hot. Exercise care in handling any charged battery, particularly when placing it inside a pocket, bag, or other container with metal objects. Use only

### 3.6 Seizures/Blackouts

Some people may be susceptible to epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to blinking lights, such as when watching television or playing video games. These seizures blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout

If you have experienced seizures or blackouts, or if you have a family history of such occurrences, please consult with your doctor before playing video games on your phone or nabling a blinking-lights feature on your phone. (The blinking-light feature is not available on all products.)

Parents should monitor their children's use of video game or other features that incorporate blinking lights on the phones All persons should discontinue use and consult a doctor if any of the following symptoms occur: convulsion, eye or muscle twitching, loss of awareness, involuntary movements, or disorientation.
To limit the likelihood of such symptoms, please take the ollowing safety precautions:

- Do not play or use a blinking-lights feature if you are tired or need sleep.
- Take a minimum of a 15 -minute break hourly.

Play in a room in which all lights are on.

- Play at the farthest distance possible from the screen.


### 3.7 Repetitive Motion Injuries

When you play games on your phone, you may experience occasional discomfort in your hands, arms, shoulders, neck, or other parts of your body. Follow these instructions to avoid problems such as tendonitis, carpal tunnel syndrome or other musculoskeletal disorders:

- Take a minimum 15-minute break every hour of game playing.
- If your hands, wrists, or arms become tired or sore while playing, stop and rest for several hours before playing again.
- If you continue to have sore hands, wrists, or arms during or after play, stop playing and see a doctor.

### 4.1.1 Optional Features

This label identifies an optional network, SIM
card, or subscription-dependent feature that may card, or subscription-dependent feature that
not be offered by all service providers in all geographical areas. Contact your service provider for more information.

### 4.2 Installing the USIM or SIM Card

Your 3G USIM (Universal IC Card) contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory. Your phone can use GSM SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) cards, but not all features will be available.

Caution: Do not bend or scratch your card. Avoid exposing your card to static electricity, water, or dirt.


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### 4.3 Memory Card

Insert the Memory Card next to the SIM card (see above) underneath the phone battery.
The Memory Card provides you with a larger storage capacity than the Phone Memory. When you download for example pictures, sounds, video clips or Java applications, they will be saved to the Memory Card.
To view a list of what is saved to either the Phone Memory or the Memory Card, press 国 and select Memory Cari/Phone Memory. See "Viewing and Managing Pictures" on page 28.

If you have a TransFlash removable memory card, the use of an SD adapter allows you to use it in other devices that are compatible with SD cards (for example, digital cameras, laptops, mp3-players).


### 4.4 Battery Tips

Battery life depends on the network, signal strength,
temperature, features, and accessories you use

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.

- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature.
- When storing your battery, keep it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Never expose batteries to temperatures below $-10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ $\left(14^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$ or above $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$. Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- It is normal for batteries to gradually wear down and require longer charging times. If you notice a change in your battery life, it is probably time to purchase a new battery.
Contact your local recycling centre for proper battery disposal.


## Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because

 they may explode.Before using your phone, please read the battery safety information in the Safety and General Information section included in this guide.

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### 4.6 Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

## Action

1 Plug the travel charger into your phone with the release tab facing up.


2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
3 When your phone indicates Charge Complete, press the release tab and remove the travel charger.

Tip: You can safely leave the travel charger connected to your phone after charging is complete. This will not damage the battery.

### 4.7 Turning Your Phone On

## Action

1 Press and hold © for 2 seconds to turn on the phone.


2 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press the OK key to unlock the SIM card.

Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays SIM Blocked.
3 If necessary, enter your four-digit unlock code and press $\mathbf{O K}$ key to unlock the phone.
Tip: The unlock code is originally set to 1234. Your service provider may change this number before you receive your phone.

### 4.8 Adjusting Volume

Press the up or down volume keys to:

- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call

- increase or decrease speakerphone volume during a call
- turn off an incoming call alert
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible
Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the down volume key once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert


### 4.9 Making a Call

To make video calls, see page 34

Note: You can make an emergency call even when the phone is locked, or when a SIM card is not inserted (see page 54).

### 4.10 Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.
When Open to Answer is On, open the phone to answer the call. To set Open to Answer, press 国 > Settings > In-Call Setup > Answer Options > Open to Answer.

## If Open to Answer is Off.



### 4.11 Changing the Call Alert

In the home screen, press the down volume key to switch the alert for incoming calls and other events to vibrate alert, then silent alert. Press the up volume key to reset ring alert.

### 4.12 Viewing Your Phone Number

To view your phone number from the home screen, press國

While you are on a call, press > My Tel. Numbers.

Note: Your phone number must be stored on your SIM card to use this feature. To store your phone number on the SIM card, see page 50 . If you do not know your phone number, contact your service provider.

### 4.13 Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.


The message centre lets you compose and send text messages.

4.13.1 Choosing a Text Entry Mode

Multiple text entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The mode you select remains active until you select another mode.

Press \# in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry modes:

| Primary | The primary text entry mode (see the <br> following section). |
| :--- | :--- |
| Numeric | Enter numbers only (see page 23). |
| Symbol | Enter symbols only (see page 23). |
| Secondary | The secondary text entry mode (see <br> below to set). |

Alternatively, you can select a text entry mode in any text entry screen by pressing $\square$ > Entry Mode.

Press 0 in any text entry screen to change text case. The following indicators show capitalisation status:

4．13．2 Using Tap Mode
This is the standard mode for entering text on your phone．
Regular Tap mode cycles through the letters and number of the key you press．Tap Extended also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the chart on page 21 ．

## Tap Text Entry Rules

- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press ©ô. left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalised. If necessary, press .ö? down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press $\sigma^{\text {to }}$ toxit without saving.


### 4.13.3 Using iTAP ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Mode

iTAPTM software provides a predictive text entry mode that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter. This can be faster than Tap, because your phone combines the
keypresses into common words.

For example, if you press 77 764, letter combinations that match your keypresses display:


If you want a different word (such as Progress), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

## Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press \# to switch entry modes. An indicator shows which mode is active (see page 18). If itiAP mode is not available as the Primary or Secondary entry mode, see page 18.

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete， and then：

Press from a text entry screen to display these options：

Text remains on your clipboard, available to paste, until you copy or cut other text or until you turn off your phone.

You can do much more with your phone than make and receive calls! This section describes some of your phone's highlight features.

### 5.1 Taking and Sending a Photo

To activate your phone's camera, press the camera key on the right side of your phone.


The active viewfinder image displays.


Take a photo.

| Pictures Setup | Open the setup menu to adjust picture <br> and video settings. |
| View Free Space | See how much memory remains for <br> storing pictures. |

Tip: To assign a stored picture to a phonebook entry, open the entry and press ${ }^{\text {E }}$ > Edilit > Pieture. You cannot assign pictures to entries stored on your SIM card.

### 5.2 Using Photos and Pictures

You can send your photos to other mobile phone users or email addresses, assign photos to specific phonebook entries, and use them as wallpaper or screen saver images.

### 5.2.1 Downloading Pictures

Your phone may contain predefined photos, pictures, and animations. You can download and store additional images on your phone.

If you are unable to establish a network connection with Vodafone live!, contact your service provider.
Note: The files that you download or receive as attachments might have a lock that keeps you from saving them on external memory, forwarding them, or editing them.

Automatical resizing of pictures
Note that if you want to insert a picture to be sent with an MMS message, pictures above 100 K in size will automatically be resized to VGA resolution when sent to another phone. If the picture is sent to an email address or another application, or as a postcard, it will retain the origina resolution provided that the maximum message size is 300 K

The original pictures will be stored in original size in the Pietures Menu.

If sending of the message fails, the message and the attached picture(s) will be saved in the outbox

### 5.3 Sending a Postcard

The Vodafone live! Postcard service allows you to send a picture as an MMS, which will be delivered as a real postcard
to a street address．You can send a picture that you have just taken，or a picture that has already been saved to your phone．You can also include a personal greeting to the postcard．
