# Firmware Upgrade

Download the latest firmware upgrade file from www.iriver.com/ support.

Unzip the firmware file (T20\_MTP.HEX) and copy the file to iriver T30:\data folder on the player.

Disconnect the USB cable.

After the player is disconnected from the computer, firmware upgrade will automatically begin.

### Note

- Before upgrading the firmware, check the condition of the battery. The firmware upgrade may fail due to battery power shortage.
- Do not turn the player off until the upgrade is completed.
- ■When the upgrade is completed, the firmware file(T20\_MTP.HEX) will be deleted automatically.
