Replacing the battery

- 1. Open the battery cover.
- Insert the battery. (AAA 1.5V type x 1ea)
 Be sure to match the + and ends of the battery with the diagram inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery cover.



Note

- To avoid corrosion, remove the battery if the player is not to be used for a long time.
- When corrosion occurs, wipe the battery compartment immediately with a dry cloth and insert a new battery.

- 1. The program installation process will start automatically after inserting the Installation CD to the PC's CD-ROM drive.

If the program installation process does not start automatically, click the "My Computer" icon and run "iriver2_setup_full.exe" file in the CD-ROM drive.



If the "Installer Language" window appears, select the desired language and click the [OK] button.

What is firmware?

Firmware Upgrade

It is the operating system that works in the T30. iriver provides you with the latest and best features through Firmware upgrade. You can choose manual or automatic upgrade function. For information on automatic upgrade.refer to the iriver plus 2 instruction manual.

1. Connect the USB cable to the USB port on the player and to your PC.



2. Open iriver plus 2. Select [Option-Firmware Upgrade 1 from the menu.

When the download is completed. disconnect USB cable to start upgrading firmware automatically.



Note

- Before upgrading the firmware, check the condition of the battery. The firmware upgrade may fail due to low battery.
- Your computer must be connected to the internet for the "Firmware Update" function.
- Do not turn the player off until the upgrade is completed.



- if there appears to be corruption on the internal hard drive.
- if an error message displays and the player doesn't boot properly.

Corrupted MP3 or WMA files may make a static noise and the sound may cut off. Listen to your files on the PC to see if they are corrupted. 		
Characters in LCD are corrupted.	■ Check out SETTINGS→Display →Language and confirm whether the right language has been selected.(Refer to page 50)		
Poor *FM Reception.	 Adjust the position of the player and earphones. Turn off the power of other electric devices near the player. The Earphone cord functions as the antenna, they must be plugged in for best reception.
